<u>peek</u>	A quick or furtive look. I only peek ed I didn t see anything interesting.
perceptual	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. A patient with perceptual problems who cannot judge distances.
<u>see</u>	Imagine conceive of see in one s mind. We went to see the Eiffel Tower in the morning.
<u>sensory</u>	Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i>The sensory cortex.</i>
sidelong	Situated at or extending to the side- Tennyson. <i>Sidelong</i> glances.
sight	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun. Tell me when you sight London Bridge.
<u>sneer</u>	A contemptuous or scornful remark. She sneer ed her contempt.
spectacle	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The acrobatic feats make a good spectacle</i> .
squint	The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed. The squint bottom edge of the puzzle.
<u>stare</u>	Fixate one's eyes. The obituaries stare d out at us.
telescopic	Relating to or made with a telescope. <i>Telescopic</i> observations.
<u>visible</u>	Visible imports or exports. A visible object.
vision	The images seen on a television screen. He had a vision of his own death.
<u>visual</u>	Relating to seeing or sight. <i>Visual powers.</i>
<u>watch</u>	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>He told me my telephones were tapped and that I was being watched.</i>
<u>wink</u>	An act of winking. Barney gave him a knowing wink .
