- *An area of sand sloping down to the water of a sea or lake.*
- *A pebbly or sandy shore, especially by the sea between high- and low-water marks.*



Synonyms of "Beach" as a noun (9 Words)

coast	A slope down which sleds may coast. <i>The west coast of Africa.</i>
coastline	The land along a coast. <i>The hotel has wonderful views of the rugged coastline.</i>
foreshore	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
margin	A profit margin. <i>Launching these new products helped increase margins and market share.</i>
seaboard	A region bordering the sea; the coastline. <i>The eastern seaboard of the United States.</i>
seashore	The shore of a sea or ocean.
seaside	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort. <i>A seaside town.</i>

shore The land between ordinary high- and low-water marks.
Record companies have been anxious to import the music to American shores.

water's edge A line determining the limits of an area.

Definitions of "Beach" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "beach" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Leave (someone) at a loss.*
- *(of an angler) land (a fish) on a beach.*
- *(of a whale or similar animal) become stranded out of the water.*
- *Run or haul up (a boat or ship) on to a beach.*
- *Land on a beach.*



Synonyms of "Beach" as a verb (16 Words)

become beached Come into existence.

become stranded Enter or assume a certain state or condition.

capture Bring about the capture of an elementary particle or celestial body and causing it enter a new orbit.

*The militia **captured** the castle.*

catch Be the catcher.

***Catch** one's breath.*

get stuck Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes.

Hit onto the ground.

ground *A bitter wind blew from the north east and the bombers were **grounded**.*

hook Make a piece of needlework by interlocking and looping thread with a hooked needle.

*He **hooked** his thumbs in his belt.*

land	Bring a fish to land with a net or rod. <i>There were more problems than ever landing on her desk.</i>
make beached	Give certain properties to something.
make stranded	Institute, enact, or establish.
marooned	Leave stranded on a desert island without resources.
reach the shore	Place into the hands or custody of.
reel in	Walk as if unable to control one's movements.
run ashore	Extend or continue for a certain period of time.
<u>strand</u>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue. <i>Quantities of sea creatures were left stranded.</i>
<u>stranded</u>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue.



Usage Examples of "Beach" as a verb

- *At the water's edge a rowing boat was beached.*
- *Competitive procurement seems to have beached several firms.*

- *He managed to beach a fine trout.*
- *The ship beached near the port.*
- *We don't know what causes whales to beach.*

- archipelago** A sea or stretch of water having many islands.
*The Indonesian **archipelago**.*
- atlantic** The 2nd largest ocean; separates North and South America on the west from Europe and Africa on the east.
- bay** A horse of a moderate reddish-brown color.
*A boat trip round the **bay**.*
- coast** Sail along the coast especially in order to carry cargo.
*They were **coasting** down a long hill.*
- coastal** Located on or near or bordering on a coast.
***Coastal** waters.*
- coastline** The outline of a coast.
*The hotel has wonderful views of the rugged **coastline**.*

dune	A mound or ridge of sand or other loose sediment formed by the wind, especially on the sea coast or in a desert. <i>A sand dune.</i>
foreshore	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
gulf	A large difference or division between two people or groups, or between viewpoints, concepts, or situations. <i>The widening gulf between the rich and the poor.</i>
insular	Lacking contact with other people. <i>Goods of insular origin.</i>
island	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>The island of Crete.</i>
islet	A small island.
isthmus	A narrow organ, passage, or piece of tissue connecting two larger parts.
ocean	A large body of water constituting a principal part of the hydrosphere. <i>They scramble across the beach to the ocean and plunge into the surf.</i>
offshore	Situated at sea some distance from the shore. <i>Offshore politics.</i>
peninsula	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.
pier	A platform on pillars projecting from the shore into the sea, typically incorporating entertainment arcades and places to eat.
sandy	Resembling or containing or abounding in sand or growing in sandy areas. <i>Pine woods and a fine sandy beach.</i>
sea	Used to refer to waves as opposed to calm sea. <i>There was still some sea running.</i>
seabed	The bottom of a sea or ocean.
seacoast	The shore of a sea or ocean.
seashore	The land between high- and low-water marks.
seaside	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort. <i>A day at the seaside.</i>
shore	Arrive on shore. <i>I made for the shore.</i>
southeast	Coming from the southeast. <i>Southeasterly breezes.</i>
strait	Narrow. <i>My captivity was strait as ever.</i>

- sunbathe** Expose one's body to the sun.
*I didn't do much apart from swim **sunbathe** and sleep.*
- tidal** Relating to or affected by tides.
*The river here is not **tidal**.*
- waterfront** The area of a city (such as a harbor or dockyard) alongside a body of water.
*A hotel on the **waterfront**.*
- windswept** Open to or swept by wind.
*His **windswept** hair.*
