<b>coastline</b>	The land along a coast. <i>The hotel has wonderful views of the rugged <b>coastline</b>.</i>
<b>foreshore</b>	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
<b>margin</b>	A profit margin. <i>Launching these new products helped increase <b>margins</b> and market share.</i>
<b>seaboard</b>	A region bordering the sea; the coastline. <i>The eastern <b>seaboard</b> of the United States.</i>
<b>seashore</b>	The shore of a sea or ocean.

**water's edge** A line determining the limits of an area.

## Beach as a Verb

### Definitions of "Beach" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "beach" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Leave (someone) at a loss.*
- *(of an angler) land (a fish) on a beach.*
- *(of a whale or similar animal) become stranded out of the water.*
- *Run or haul up (a boat or ship) on to a beach.*
- *Land on a beach.*



## Synonyms of "Beach" as a verb (16 Words)

**become beached** Come into existence.

**become stranded** Enter or assume a certain state or condition.

**capture** Bring about the capture of an elementary particle or celestial body and causing it enter a new orbit.  
*The militia **captured** the castle.*

**catch** Be the catcher.  
***Catch** one's breath.*

**get stuck** Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes).  
Hit onto the ground.

**ground** *A bitter wind blew from the north east and the bombers were **grounded**.*

**hook** Make a piece of needlework by interlocking and looping thread with a hooked needle.  
*He **hooked** his thumbs in his belt.*



<b>land</b>	Bring a fish to land with a net or rod. <i>There were more problems than ever <b>landing</b> on her desk.</i>
<b>make beached</b>	Give certain properties to something.
<b>make stranded</b>	Institute, enact, or establish.
<b>marooned</b>	Leave stranded on a desert island without resources.
<b>reach the shore</b>	Place into the hands or custody of.
<b>reel in</b>	Walk as if unable to control one's movements.
<b>run ashore</b>	Extend or continue for a certain period of time.
<u><a href="#">strand</a></u>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue. <i>Quantities of sea creatures were left <b>stranded</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">stranded</a></u>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue.

<b>atlantic</b>	The 2nd largest ocean; separates North and South America on the west from Europe and Africa on the east.
<a href="#"><u>bay</u></a>	A horse of a moderate reddish-brown color. <i>A boat trip round the <b>bay</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>coast</u></a>	Sail along the coast especially in order to carry cargo. <i>They were <b>coasting</b> down a long hill.</i>
<b>coastal</b>	Located on or near or bordering on a coast. <i><b>Coastal</b> waters.</i>

<b>foreshore</b>	The part of a shore between high- and low-water marks, or between the water and cultivated or developed land.
<b>gulf</b>	A large difference or division between two people or groups, or between viewpoints, concepts, or situations. <i>The widening <b>gulf</b> between the rich and the poor.</i>
<b>insular</b>	Lacking contact with other people. <i>Goods of <b>insular</b> origin.</i>
<b>island</b>	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>The <b>island</b> of Crete.</i>
<b>islet</b>	A small island.
<b>isthmus</b>	A narrow organ, passage, or piece of tissue connecting two larger parts.
<b>ocean</b>	A large body of water constituting a principal part of the hydrosphere. <i>They scramble across the beach to the <b>ocean</b> and plunge into the surf.</i>
<b>offshore</b>	Situated at sea some distance from the shore. <i><b>Offshore</b> politics.</i>
<b>peninsula</b>	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.
<b>pier</b>	A platform on pillars projecting from the shore into the sea, typically incorporating entertainment arcades and places to eat.
<b>sandy</b>	Resembling or containing or abounding in sand or growing in sandy areas. <i>Pine woods and a fine <b>sandy</b> beach.</i>
<b>sea</b>	Used to refer to waves as opposed to calm sea. <i>There was still some <b>sea</b> running.</i>
<b>seabed</b>	The bottom of a sea or ocean.
<b>seacoast</b>	The shore of a sea or ocean.
<b>seashore</b>	The land between high- and low-water marks.
<b>seaside</b>	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort. <i>A day at the <b>seaside</b>.</i>
<b>shore</b>	Arrive on shore. <i>I made for the <b>shore</b>.</i>
<b>southeast</b>	Coming from the southeast. <i><b>Southeasterly</b> breezes.</i>
<b>strait</b>	Narrow. <i>My captivity was <b>strait</b> as ever.</i>
