<b>buttony</b>	Ornamented with many buttons. <i>Black <b>buttony</b> eyes.</i>
<b>gemmed</b>	Decorated with or as with gems. <i>A <b>gemmed</b> necklace.</i>
<b>jeweled</b>	Covered with beads or jewels or sequins.
<b>jewelled</b>	Covered with beads or jewels or sequins. <i>A <b>jewelled</b> dagger.</i>
<b>keen</b>	Interested in or attracted by (someone or something). <i>Bob makes it obvious he s <b>keen</b> on her.</i>

<b>observant</b>	Paying close attention especially to details. <i><b>Observant</b> of the speed limit.</i>
<b>perceptive</b>	Of or relating to perception. <i>An extraordinarily <b>perceptive</b> account of their relationship.</i>
<b>sequined</b>	Covered with beads or jewels or sequins.
<b>sharp-sighted</b>	Keenly perceptive or alert- Leonard Bacon.
<b>spangled</b>	Covered with beads or jewels or sequins. <i>A fireworks display on the beach lit up the star <b>spangled</b> sky.</i>
<b>spangly</b>	Covered with beads or jewels or sequins.



### Usage Examples of "Beady" as an adjective

- *Bright beady eyes.*

- *She blinks her blue beady eyes.*
- *I shall certainly keep a beady eye on this development.*
- *A beady-eyed observer.*



## Associations of "Beady" (30 Words)

- amber** A honey yellow colour typical of amber.  
*Amber* eyes.
- amethyst** A precious stone consisting of a violet or purple variety of quartz.  
An *amethyst* dress.
- beaded** Covered with beads of liquid.  
*Beaded* chiffon dresses.
- bracelet** An ornamental band, hoop, or chain worn on the wrist or arm.
- braid** Form or weave into a braid or braids.  
*Their garments were braided with silk.*

<b>brooch</b>	Fasten with or as if with a brooch.
<b>calcite</b>	A white or colourless mineral consisting of calcium carbonate. It is a major constituent of sedimentary rocks such as limestone and is deposited in caves to form stalactites and stalagmites.
<b>chain</b>	Confine with a chain. <i>The action would initiate a <b>chain</b> of events.</i>
<b>circlet</b>	A circular band, typically one made of precious metal, worn on the head as an ornament.
<b>crystal</b>	Clear and transparent like crystal. <i>A collection of <b>crystal</b>.</i>
<b>dangle</b>	Cause to dangle or hang freely. <i>Saucepans <b>dangled</b> from a rail.</i>
<b>diamond</b>	A transparent piece of diamond that has been cut and polished and is valued as a precious gem. <i><b>Diamonds</b> were trumps.</i>
<b>earring</b>	Jewelry to ornament the ear; usually clipped to the earlobe or fastened through a hole in the lobe.
<b>gem</b>	Decorate with or as with gems. <i>Tiny drops of sweat <b>gemmed</b> his forehead.</i>
<b>glass</b>	A container made of glass for holding liquids while drinking. <i>A <b>glass</b> door.</i>
<b>gold</b>	Made of or coloured like gold. <i>The <b>gold</b> dome of the Capitol.</i>
<b>granulate</b>	Form into grains. <i>We have the capacity to <b>granulate</b> 100 of the potash we produce.</i>
<b>jade</b>	A semiprecious gemstone that takes a high polish is usually green but sometimes whitish consists of jadeite or nephrite. <i>A silk blouse in a vivid <b>jade</b> green.</i>
<b>jewelry</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
<b>medallion</b>	An oval or circular painting, panel, or design used to decorate a building or textile. <i><b>Medallions</b> of veal.</i>
<b>nacre</b>	Mother-of-pearl.
<b>necklace</b>	In South Africa kill someone with a tyre necklace. <i>A diamond <b>necklace</b>.</i>

- nephrite** A hard, pale green or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of calcium and magnesium.
- ornament** Be an ornament to.  
*Sense of humour is an **ornament** to character.*
- pearl** Something resembling a pearl.  
*These things are **pearls** amidst the everyday.*
- pendant** A necklace with a pendant.  
*I slipped the **pendant** over my neck.*
- quartz** A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
- ring** A ring shaped or circular object.  
*Through traffic is diverted along the outer **ring**.*
- turquoise** A blue to grey green mineral consisting of copper aluminum phosphate.  
*The **turquoise** waters of the bay.*
- wampum** Informal terms for money.  
*Strings of **wampum**.*
