Associations of "Beat up" (30 Words)

ascend	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>She ascended to the throne after the King's death.</i>
ascending	Increasing in size or importance. <i>The ascending staircase.</i>
ascent	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>The first balloon ascent was in 1783.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>A boost in exports.</i>
<u>climb</u>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>Howard started to climb out of the front seat.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position. <i>She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to elevate the Host.</i>
elevator	A machine consisting of an endless belt with scoops attached, used for raising grain to an upper storey for storage. <i>Elevators of the upper lip.</i>
escalator	A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index).
heave	Lift or elevate. <i>She heaved half a brick at him.</i>
<u>hoist</u>	Lifting device for raising heavy or cumbersome objects. <i>An interest rate hoist.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>Employees on their way up the career ladder.</i>

lift	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>Lift the tulip bulbs.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
<u>precipitate</u>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>The incident precipitated a political crisis.</i>
raise	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>It is hoped that the event will raise 50 000.</i>
rise	Rise to one s feet. <i>Rise to the occasion.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Advancing or becoming higher or greater in degree or value or status. <i>Rising ground.</i>
<u>soar</u>	Fly by means of a hang glider. <i>The gulls soared on the summery winds.</i>
<u>soaring</u>	Flying or rising high in the air. <i>The coloured trails of soaring rockets.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
<u>surmount</u>	Overcome (a difficulty or obstacle). <i>The tomb was surmounted by a sculptured angel.</i>
<u>underpin</u>	Support from beneath. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i>
uphill	Sloping upwards. <i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep uphills.</i>
upstairs	Situated on an upper floor. <i>The upstairs maid.</i>
upward	Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>The cards were face upward.</i>
vertically	(with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. <i>The bacteria are vertically transmitted from mother to offspring.</i>
<u>zoom</u>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The value of these stocks is zooming.</i>
