## Associations of "Became" (30 Words)

<b>act</b>	Be engaged in an activity often for no particular purpose other than pleasure. <i>In what capacity are you <b>acting</b>.</i>
<b>be</b>	Be identical or equivalent to. <i>He s a tough customer let him <b>be</b>.</i>
<b>behave</b>	Behave in a certain manner. <i>Just <b>behave</b> Tom he said.</i>
<b>behaviour</b>	(behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people. <i>Management is a set of techniques and <b>behaviours</b> for getting things done.</i>
<b>completed</b>	Of a marriage completed by the first act of sexual intercourse after the ceremony. <i>A <b>completed</b> forward pass.</i>
<b>comport</b>	Accord or agree with. <i>Articulate students who <b>comported</b> themselves well in interviews.</i>
<b>compose</b>	Calm (someone, especially oneself); make quiet. <i>He <b>composed</b> the First Violin Sonata four years earlier.</i>
<b>comprise</b>	Form or compose. <i>These few men <b>comprise</b> his entire army.</i>
<b>conduct</b>	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>Many metals <b>conduct</b> heat.</i>
<b>consider</b>	Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes. <i>The judge <b>considered</b> the offender s youth and was lenient.</i>
<b>constitute</b>	Give legal or constitutional form to (an institution); establish by law. <i>His failure to act <b>constituted</b> a breach of duty.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Build or make (something, typically a building, road, or machine). <i>Re<b>construct</b> the events of 20 years ago.</i>
<b>deed</b>	Convey or transfer property or rights by legal deed. <i>Mortgage <b>deeds</b>.</i>

<b>demeanor</b>	The way a person behaves toward other people.
<b>do</b>	Doctor's degree in osteopathy. <i>He decided to <b>do</b> her a favour.</i>
<b>done</b>	Having finished or arrived at completion. <i>Therapy was not the <b>done</b> thing then.</i>
<b>ethology</b>	The science of animal behaviour.
<b>institute</b>	Set up or lay the groundwork for. <i>A testator who has <b>instituted</b> his daughter heir.</i>
<b>make</b>	Make or cause to be or to become. <i><b>Make</b> laws.</i>
<b>makeup</b>	An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event. <i>He missed the test and had to take a <b>makeup</b>.</i>
<b>organize</b>	Arrange or form into a living being or tissue. <i><b>Organize</b> lessons in a planned way.</i>
<b>prepare</b>	Prepare for eating by applying heat. <i>Schools should <b>prepare</b> children for life.</i>
<b>pretension</b>	The quality of being pretentious (behaving or speaking in such a manner as to create a false appearance of great importance or worth. <i>The town still puts forward <b>pretensions</b> as a famous resort.</i>
<b>priesthood</b>	The body of ordained religious practitioners. <i>There was relief among the Anglican <b>priesthood</b>.</i>
<b>quorum</b>	The minimum number of members of an assembly or society that must be present at any of its meetings to make the proceedings of that meeting valid.
<b>volition</b>	The capability of conscious choice and decision and intention- George Meredith. <i>Without conscious <b>volition</b> she backed into her office.</i>
<b>volitional</b>	With deliberate intention. <i>Acceptance is a <b>volitional</b> act.</i>
<b>voluntary</b>	A piece of music performed extempore, especially as a prelude to other music, or composed in a free style. <i><b>Voluntary</b> contraction of the calf muscles.</i>
<b>wax</b>	Cover or treat something with wax or a similar substance typically to polish or protect it. <i>I washed and <b>waxed</b> the floor.</i>
<b>will</b>	Expressing desire consent or willingness. <i>This action was <b>willed</b> and intended.</i>
