act	Be engaged in an activity often for no particular purpose other than pleasure. <i>In what capacity are you acting.</i>
be	Be identical or equivalent to. <i>He s a tough customer let him be.</i>
behave	Behave in a certain manner. <i>Just behave Tom he said.</i>
behaviour	(behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people. <i>Management is a set of techniques and behaviours for getting things done.</i>
completed	Of a marriage completed by the first act of sexual intercourse after the ceremony. <i>A completed forward pass.</i>
comport	Accord or agree with. <i>Articulate students who comported themselves well in interviews.</i>
compose	Calm (someone, especially oneself); make quiet. <i>He composed the First Violin Sonata four years earlier.</i>
comprise	Form or compose. <i>These few men comprise his entire army.</i>
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>Many metals conduct heat.</i>
consider	Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes. <i>The judge considered the offender s youth and was lenient.</i>
constitute	Give legal or constitutional form to (an institution); establish by law. <i>His failure to act constituted a breach of duty.</i>
construct	Build or make (something, typically a building, road, or machine). <i>Reconstruct the events of 20 years ago.</i>
deed	Convey or transfer property or rights by legal deed. <i>Mortgage deeds.</i>

demeanor	The way a person behaves toward other people.
do	Doctor's degree in osteopathy. <i>He decided to do her a favour.</i>
done	Having finished or arrived at completion. <i>Therapy was not the done thing then.</i>
ethology	The science of animal behaviour.
institute	Set up or lay the groundwork for. <i>A testator who has instituted his daughter heir.</i>
make	Make or cause to be or to become. <i>Make laws.</i>
makeup	An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event. <i>He missed the test and had to take a makeup.</i>
organize	Arrange or form into a living being or tissue. <i>Organize lessons in a planned way.</i>
prepare	Prepare for eating by applying heat. <i>Schools should prepare children for life.</i>
pretension	The quality of being pretentious (behaving or speaking in such a manner as to create a false appearance of great importance or worth). <i>The town still puts forward pretensions as a famous resort.</i>
priesthood	The body of ordained religious practitioners. <i>There was relief among the Anglican priesthood.</i>
quorum	The minimum number of members of an assembly or society that must be present at any of its meetings to make the proceedings of that meeting valid.
volition	The capability of conscious choice and decision and intention- George Meredith. <i>Without conscious volition she backed into her office.</i>
volitional	With deliberate intention. <i>Acceptance is a volitional act.</i>
voluntary	A piece of music performed extempore, especially as a prelude to other music, or composed in a free style. <i>Voluntary contraction of the calf muscles.</i>
wax	Cover or treat something with wax or a similar substance typically to polish or protect it. <i>I washed and waxed the floor.</i>
will	Expressing desire consent or willingness. <i>This action was willed and intended.</i>
