sick-abed	Confined to bed (by illness.

<u>ailing</u>	Somewhat ill or prone to illness. <i>My poor ailing grandmother.</i>
<u>ailment</u>	An illness, typically a minor one. <i>The doctor diagnosed a common stomach ailment.</i>
<u>anemic</u>	Relating to anemia or suffering from anemia. <i>An anemic attempt to hit the baseball.</i>
asthmatic	Relating to breathing with a whistling sound. <i>She is a chronic asthmatic.</i>
bilious	Suffering from or suggesting a liver disorder or gastric distress. <i>A bilious attack.</i>
<u>catching</u>	The act of detecting something catching sight of something. <i>Her enthusiasm is catching.</i>
consumptive	Afflicted with or associated with pulmonary tuberculosis. <i>A consumptive patient.</i>
convalescence	Time spent recovering from an illness or medical treatment; recuperation. <i>I had a long convalescence ahead.</i>
convalescent	A person who is recovering from illness. <i>You re still convalescent and you need to rest.</i>
delayed	Not as far along as normal in development.
<u>delirious</u>	In a state of wild excitement or ecstasy. <i>A crowd of delirious baseball fans.</i>
diabetes	A disease in which the body's ability to produce or respond to the hormone insulin is impaired, resulting in abnormal metabolism of carbohydrates and elevated levels of glucose in the blood.
<u>diagnose</u>	Determine or distinguish the nature of a problem or an illness through a diagnostic analysis. <i>Two doctors failed to diagnose a punctured lung.</i>
disabled	People collectively who are crippled or otherwise physically handicapped. <i>Technology to help the elderly and the disabled.</i>
disturbed	Having had the normal pattern or functioning disrupted. <i>Lapsed into disturbed sleep.</i>
<u>dizzy</u>	Make dizzy or giddy. <i>A sheer dizzy drop.</i>
dyspeptic	A person suffering from indigestion.
embolism	Obstruction of an artery, typically by a clot of blood or an air bubble. <i>One patient died of a pulmonary embolism.</i>

giddy	Having a sensation of whirling and a tendency to fall or stagger; dizzy. <i>Had a headache and felt giddy.</i>
indisposed	Somewhat ill or prone to illness. <i>Feeling a bit indisposed today.</i>
malinger	Pretend to be ill in order to escape duty or work. <i>People who had psychosomatic complaints were probably malingering.</i>
nauseous	Causing nausea. <i>The smell was nauseous.</i>
<u>paralyzed</u>	Affected with paralysis.
pathological	Compulsive; obsessive. <i>Pathological laboratory.</i>
<u>poorly</u>	In a way that is unsatisfactory or inadequate. <i>Schools that were performing poorly.</i>
recovery	An object or amount of money recovered. <i>The brace is used as a recovery stroke to avoid capsizing.</i>
<u>unhealthy</u>	Not conducive to good health. <i>An unhealthy obsession with fast cars.</i>
unwell	Somewhat ill or prone to illness. <i>Is unwell and can't come to work.</i>
wheelchair	A chair fitted with wheels for use as a means of transport by a person who is unable to walk as a result of illness, injury, or disability.
