A bedroom.

boudoir

A lady's bedroom or private sitting room.

commuter

Someone who travels regularly from home in a suburb to work in a city.

*A fault on the line caused widespread delays for **commuters**.*

A desirable person or thing.

*The store sells various **desirables**.*

dormitory

A small town or suburb providing a residential area for those who work in a nearby city.

*He visited the borders in their **dormitory**.*

dressng room

The act of applying a bandage.

room	A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>The rooms were very small but they had a nice view.</i>
sleeping accommodation	Quiet and inactive restfulness.
sleeping room	The suspension of consciousness and decrease in metabolic rate.

- *A bedroom community.*
- *She revealed the couple's bedroom secrets.*

Associations of "Bedroom" (30 Words)

<u>apartment</u>	A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house. <i>The family lived in a rented apartment.</i>
bedside	The space beside a bed (used especially with reference to an invalid's bed). <i>A bedside lamp.</i>
<u>bungalow</u>	A small house with a single story.
<u>bunk</u>	Sleep in a bunk or improvised bed typically in shared quarters. <i>We bunked the children upstairs.</i>
caravan	Travel in a caravan. <i>A caravan of cars and trucks.</i>
<u>ceiling</u>	The inside planking of a ship's bottom and sides. <i>The government imposed a wage ceiling of 3 per cent.</i>

condominium	The system of ownership by which condominiums operate in which owners have full title to the individual apartment or house and an undivided interest in the shared parts of the property. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian condominium.</i>
cottage	A small house with a single story. <i>They said that at some point in their lives they ve cottaged or cruised in parks.</i>
doorstep	(of a journalist) wait uninvited outside the home of (someone) in order to obtain an interview or photograph. <i>He was being doorstepped by the tabloids.</i>
duplex	Having two parts used technically of a device or process duplex adj allowing communication in opposite directions simultaneously. <i>Duplex system.</i>
edifice	A large, imposing building. <i>The concepts on which the edifice of capitalism was built.</i>
floor	Provide a room or area with a floor. <i>A third floor flat.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
furnished	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A full sized fully furnished apartment.</i>
furnishing	(usually plural) the instrumentalities (furniture and appliances and other movable accessories including curtains and rugs) that make a home (or other area) livable. <i>A large room filled with fine ornaments and luxurious furnishings.</i>
habitable	Fit for habitation. <i>The habitable world.</i>
home	Provide an animal with a home as a pet. <i>Home is where the heart is.</i>
homestead	Settle land given by the government and occupy it as a homestead.
hotel	A pub. <i>A hotel room.</i>
house	The people living in a house a household. <i>He counted the house.</i>
indoors	Within a building. <i>The rain makes indoors feel so warm and safe.</i>

interior	(in filming) indoor. <i>Interior decoration.</i>
<u>kitchen</u>	A set of fittings and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i>Kitchen Swahili.</i>
mews	A group of stables, typically with rooms above, built round a yard or along an alley. <i>A mews house.</i>
rental	An amount paid or received as rent. <i>A nominal rental.</i>
<u>residence</u>	A person's home, especially a large and impressive one. <i>She took up residence in Paris.</i>
<u>room</u>	A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>She made room for Josh on the sofa.</i>
sleeping	Lying with head on paws as if sleeping. <i>It was 30 degrees at 1 a m a few weeks ago and sleeping was near impossible.</i>
<u>suite</u>	A group of minerals, rocks, or fossils occurring together and characteristic of a location or period. <i>A suite of reception rooms.</i>
upstairs	An upper floor. <i>An upstairs room.</i>
