**commuter**

Someone who travels regularly from home in a suburb to work in a city.

*A fault on the line caused widespread delays for **commuters**.*

[desirable](#)

A desirable person or thing.

*The store sells various **desirables**.*

**dormitory**

A small town or suburb providing a residential area for those who work in a nearby city.

*He visited the borders in their **dormitory**.*

**dressng room**

The act of applying a bandage.

- room** A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live.  
*The **rooms** were very small but they had a nice view.*
- sleeping accommodation** Quiet and inactive restfulness.
- sleeping room** The suspension of consciousness and decrease in metabolic rate.

## Associations of "Bedroom" (30 Words)

<a href="#">apartment</a>	A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house. <i>The family lived in a rented <b>apartment</b>.</i>
<b>bedside</b>	The space beside a bed (used especially with reference to an invalid's bed). <i>A <b>bedside</b> lamp.</i>
<a href="#">bungalow</a>	A small house with a single story.
<a href="#">bunk</a>	Sleep in a bunk or improvised bed typically in shared quarters. <i>We <b>bunked</b> the children upstairs.</i>
<b>caravan</b>	Travel in a caravan. <i>A <b>caravan</b> of cars and trucks.</i>
<a href="#">ceiling</a>	The inside planking of a ship's bottom and sides. <i>The government imposed a wage <b>ceiling</b> of 3 per cent.</i>

<b>condominium</b>	The system of ownership by which condominiums operate in which owners have full title to the individual apartment or house and an undivided interest in the shared parts of the property. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian <b>condominium</b>.</i>
<b>cottage</b>	A small house with a single story. <i>They said that at some point in their lives they ve <b>cottaged</b> or cruised in parks.</i>
<b>doorstep</b>	(of a journalist) wait uninvited outside the home of (someone) in order to obtain an interview or photograph. <i>He was being <b>doorstepped</b> by the tabloids.</i>
<b>duplex</b>	Having two parts used technically of a device or process duplex adj allowing communication in opposite directions simultaneously. <i><b>Duplex</b> system.</i>
<b>edifice</b>	A large, imposing building. <i>The concepts on which the <b>edifice</b> of capitalism was built.</i>
<b>floor</b>	Provide a room or area with a floor. <i>A third <b>floor</b> flat.</i>
<b>flophouse</b>	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a <b>flophouse</b> and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
<b>furnished</b>	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A full sized fully <b>furnished</b> apartment.</i>
<b>furnishing</b>	(usually plural) the instrumentalities (furniture and appliances and other movable accessories including curtains and rugs) that make a home (or other area) livable. <i>A large room filled with fine ornaments and luxurious <b>furnishings</b>.</i>
<b>habitable</b>	Fit for habitation. <i>The <b>habitable</b> world.</i>
<b>home</b>	Provide an animal with a home as a pet. <i><b>Home</b> is where the heart is.</i>
<b>homestead</b>	Settle land given by the government and occupy it as a homestead.
<b>hotel</b>	A pub. <i>A <b>hotel</b> room.</i>
<b>house</b>	The people living in a house a household. <i>He counted the <b>house</b>.</i>
<b>indoors</b>	Within a building. <i>The rain makes <b>indoors</b> feel so warm and safe.</i>

<b>interior</b>	(in filming) indoor. <i><b>Interior</b> decoration.</i>
<b><u>kitchen</u></b>	A set of fitments and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i><b>Kitchen</b> Swahili.</i>
<b>mews</b>	A group of stables, typically with rooms above, built round a yard or along an alley. <i>A <b>mews</b> house.</i>
<b>rental</b>	An amount paid or received as rent. <i>A nominal <b>rental</b>.</i>
<b><u>residence</u></b>	A person's home, especially a large and impressive one. <i>She took up <b>residence</b> in Paris.</i>
<b><u>room</u></b>	A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>She made <b>room</b> for Josh on the sofa.</i>
<b>sleeping</b>	Lying with head on paws as if sleeping. <i>It was 30 degrees at 1 a m a few weeks ago and <b>sleeping</b> was near impossible.</i>
<b><u>suite</u></b>	A group of minerals, rocks, or fossils occurring together and characteristic of a location or period. <i>A <b>suite</b> of reception rooms.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	An upper floor. <i>An <b>upstairs</b> room.</i>
