abide	Live; dwell. <i>Many unskilful Men do abide in our City of London.</i>
<u>being</u>	Being alive living. <i>The single market came into being in 1993.</i>
coexistence	The state or fact of living or existing at the same time or in the same place. <i>A harmonious coexistence between wildlife and livestock.</i>
concurrent	(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point. <i>She was given nine months concurrent for each offence.</i>
<u>constitute</u>	Give legal or constitutional form to (an institution); establish by law. <i>His failure to act constituted a breach of duty.</i>
<u>creature</u>	A person of a specified kind. <i>Dress jewels and other transitory creatures.</i>
<u>dwell</u>	A slight regular pause in the motion of a machine. <i>This kind of fish dwells near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
dweller	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>City dwellers.</i>
<u>eternally</u>	In a way that continues or lasts forever; permanently. <i>His eternally optimistic attitude.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>Two conflicting stereotypes of housework exist in popular thinking.</i>
existence	Continued survival. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous existences.</i>
existing	Presently existing. <i>Opponents of the existing political system.</i>
<u>extant</u>	Still in existence; surviving. <i>An extant letter.</i>

happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>The afternoon when the disturbance happened.</i>
here	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i>I m here to help you.</i>
inhabit	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Sweet memories inhabit this house.</i>
lifelong	Continuing through life. <i>The two men were to remain lifelong friends.</i>
live	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>A live wire.</i>
living	People who are still living. <i>Carved into the living stone.</i>
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>A divorced man paying his ex wife 2 500 a year maintenance.</i>
occur	Come to one's mind; suggest itself. <i>Sexism occurs in many workplaces.</i>
outlast	Live or last longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will outlast youth.</i>
pertain	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets pertaining to the business.</i>
populate	Fill or be present in (a place or sphere). <i>Populate the forest with deer and wild boar for hunting.</i>
recur	Occur again periodically or repeatedly. <i>When the symptoms recurred the doctor diagnosed something different.</i>
reside	Live (in a certain place). <i>Legislative powers reside with the Federal Assembly.</i>
somewhere	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>She must be somewhere.</i>
stay	Stay behind. <i>Some men are always great at beginnings but they have no stay in them.</i>
subsist	Provide sustenance for. <i>The court may treat a contract as still subsisting.</i>
survive	Continue to live or exist, especially in spite of danger or hardship. <i>Against all odds the child survived.</i>
