## Associations of "Been" (30 Words)

<b>abide</b>	Live; dwell. <i>Many unskilful Men do <b>abide</b> in our City of London.</i>
<b>being</b>	Being alive living. <i>The single market came into <b>being</b> in 1993.</i>
<b>coexistence</b>	The state or fact of living or existing at the same time or in the same place. <i>A harmonious <b>coexistence</b> between wildlife and livestock.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point. <i>She was given nine months <b>concurrent</b> for each offence.</i>
<b>constitute</b>	Give legal or constitutional form to (an institution); establish by law. <i>His failure to act <b>constituted</b> a breach of duty.</i>
<b>creature</b>	A person of a specified kind. <i>Dress jewels and other transitory <b>creatures</b>.</i>
<b>dwell</b>	A slight regular pause in the motion of a machine. <i>This kind of fish <b>dwells</b> near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
<b>dweller</b>	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>City <b>dwellers</b>.</i>
<b>eternally</b>	In a way that continues or lasts forever; permanently. <i>His <b>eternally</b> optimistic attitude.</i>
<b>exist</b>	Have an existence be extant. <i>Two conflicting stereotypes of housework <b>exist</b> in popular thinking.</i>
<b>existence</b>	Continued survival. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous <b>existences</b>.</i>
<b>existing</b>	Presently existing. <i>Opponents of the <b>existing</b> political system.</i>
<b>extant</b>	Still in existence; surviving. <i>An <b>extant</b> letter.</i>

<b>happen</b>	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>The afternoon when the disturbance <b>happened</b>.</i>
<b>here</b>	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i>I m <b>here</b> to help you.</i>
<b>inhabit</b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Sweet memories <b>inhabit</b> this house.</i>
<b>lifelong</b>	Continuing through life. <i>The two men were to remain <b>lifelong</b> friends.</i>
<b>live</b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>A <b>live</b> wire.</i>
<b>living</b>	People who are still living. <i>Carved into the <b>living</b> stone.</i>
<b>maintenance</b>	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>A divorced man paying his ex wife 2 500 a year <b>maintenance</b>.</i>
<b>occur</b>	Come to one's mind; suggest itself. <i>Sexism <b>occurs</b> in many workplaces.</i>
<b>outlast</b>	Live or last longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will <b>outlast</b> youth.</i>
<b>pertain</b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets <b>pertaining</b> to the business.</i>
<b>populate</b>	Fill or be present in (a place or sphere). <i><b>Populate</b> the forest with deer and wild boar for hunting.</i>
<b>recur</b>	Occur again periodically or repeatedly. <i>When the symptoms <b>recurred</b> the doctor diagnosed something different.</i>
<b>reside</b>	Live (in a certain place). <i>Legislative powers <b>reside</b> with the Federal Assembly.</i>
<b>somewhere</b>	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>She must be <b>somewhere</b>.</i>
<b>stay</b>	Stay behind. <i>Some men are always great at beginnings but they have no <b>stay</b> in them.</i>
<b>subsist</b>	Provide sustenance for. <i>The court may treat a contract as still <b>subsisting</b>.</i>
<b>survive</b>	Continue to live or exist, especially in spite of danger or hardship. <i>Against all odds the child <b>survived</b>.</i>
