Beer as a Noun

Definitions of "Beer" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “beer” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops.*
- *A general name for alcoholic beverages made by fermenting a cereal (or mixture of cereals) flavored with hops.*



Synonyms of "Beer" as a noun (3 Words)

ale A general name for beer made with a top fermenting yeast in some of the United States an ale is by law a brew of more than 4 alcohol by volume.

*A draught of **ale**.*

beverage (chiefly in commercial use) a drink other than water.
*May I take your **beverage** order.*

brew A cup or mug of tea or coffee.
*Small **breweries** which are able to offer rare **brews**.*



Usage Examples of "Beer" as a noun

- *He ordered a beer.*
- *A pint of beer.*
- *A beer bottle.*



Associations of "Beer" (30 Words)

alcohol	A liquor or brew containing alcohol as the active agent. <i>Polyvinyl alcohol.</i>
alcoholic	Addicted to alcohol- Carl Van Doren. <i>Alcoholic liver disease.</i>
bacchanal	A wild and drunken celebration. <i>The debauched and alcoholic president was said to be organizing unceasing bacchanals.</i>
bacchanalian	Characterized by or given to drunken revelry. <i>A night of bacchanalian revelry.</i>
bibulous	Excessively fond of drinking alcohol. <i>A bibulous fellow.</i>
carousal	Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.

carouse	A noisy, lively drinking party. <i>Corporate carouses.</i>
cocktail	An alcoholic drink consisting of a spirit or spirits mixed with other ingredients, such as fruit juice or cream. <i>A chilled lobster cocktail prettily presented in a martini glass.</i>
distiller	A person or company that manufactures spirits. <i>A family owned whisky distiller.</i>
drink	A social gathering at which alcoholic drinks are served. <i>He took a drink of his beer and smacked his lips.</i>
drinker	A person who drinks alcoholic beverages (especially to excess). <i>A heavy drinker.</i>
drunken	Drunk or intoxicated. <i>A drunken binge.</i>
guzzle	Eat or drink (something) greedily. <i>He would guzzle his ale.</i>
inebriate	Make (someone) drunk; intoxicate. <i>Inebriate times by the Bay.</i>
<u>inebriated</u>	Drunk; intoxicated. <i>I got mildly inebriated.</i>
inebriety	A temporary state resulting from excessive consumption of alcohol. <i>The ravages of inebriety.</i>
intoxicate	Have an intoxicating effect on, of a drug. <i>Van Gogh went to Provence where he was intoxicated by the Mediterranean sunlight.</i>
liqueur	A chocolate with a liqueur filling. <i>Fruit cocktail laced with liqueur.</i>
liquor	Water used in brewing. <i>Waste liquors.</i>
<u>revel</u>	Get great pleasure from (a situation or experience). <i>They spent the evening revelling with their guests.</i>
reveler	A celebrant who shares in a noisy party. <i>The clubs attract revelers as young as thirteen.</i>
<u>revelry</u>	Unrestrained merrymaking. <i>Sounds of revelry issued into the night.</i>
<u>sober</u>	Make or become sober after drinking alcohol. <i>A sober grey suit.</i>

spree Take part in a spree.
*They don't want work they're too busy **spreeing**.*

tipple A serving of drink (usually alcoholic) drawn from a keg.
*She drank several glasses of sherry her favourite **tipple**.*

tipsy Slightly intoxicated.
***Tipsy** revellers.*
