## Associations of "Begged" (30 Words)

appeal	Request earnestly (something from somebody); ask for aid or protection. I <b>appeal</b> ed to his sense of justice.
asking	The verbal act of requesting.
<u>beseech</u>	Ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat. You have got to believe me Violet <b>beseech</b> ed him.
cadge	Obtain or seek to obtain by cadging or wheedling. <i>He <b>cadge</b>d fivers off old school friends.</i>
<u>conjure</u>	Ask for or request earnestly. They hoped to <b>conjure</b> up the spirit of their dead friend.
<u>crave</u>	Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for. Will <b>crave</b> d for family life.
<u>desperately</u>	Used to emphasize the extreme degree of something. The soil <b>desperately</b> needed potash.
<u>entreat</u>	Ask for or request earnestly. His friends <b>entreat</b> ed him not to go.
entreaty	Earnest or urgent request. An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.
exhortation	An address or communication emphatically urging someone to do something. <b>Exhortation</b> s to consumers to switch off electrical appliances.
implore	Beg someone earnestly or desperately to do something. I <b>implore</b> mercy.
<u>invitation</u>	A situation or action that tempts someone to do something or makes a particular outcome likely. A club with membership by <b>invitation</b> only.
mendicant	A member of a mendicant order. <i>Mendicant friars.</i>



necessary	Determined, existing, or happening by natural laws or predestination; inevitable. See when they need a tactful word of advice and do the <b>necessary</b> .
need	Have or feel a need for. They <b>need</b> to win tomorrow.
perforce	Used to express necessity or inevitability. Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.
<u>petition</u>	Write a petition for something to somebody request formally and in writing. The organization is <b>petition</b> ing the EU for a moratorium on the patent.
<u>plea</u>	A formal statement by or on behalf of a defendant or prisoner, stating guilt or innocence in response to a charge, offering an allegation of fact, or claiming that a point of law should apply. Her <b>plea</b> of a headache was not entirely false.
<u>plead</u>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>She <b>plead</b>ed not guilty.</i>
<u>please</u>	Give satisfaction. Would you like a drink Yes <b>please</b> .
<u>pray</u>	Address a prayer to God or another deity. Ladies and gentlemen <b>pray</b> be seated.
propitiate	Win or regain the favour of (a god, spirit, or person) by doing something that pleases them. The pagans thought it was important to <b>propitiate</b> the gods with sacrifices.
request	A tune or song played on a radio programme typically accompanied by a personal message in response to a listener s request. The computer is busy servicing <b>request</b> s from other processes.
<u>solicit</u>	Make a solicitation or entreaty for something request urgently or persistently. <i>Historians and critics are</i> <b>solicit</b> ed for opinions by the auction houses.
<u>solicitation</u>	The act of asking for or trying to obtain something from someone. <i>He was a regular target for <b>solicitation</b> of funds.</i>
suppliant	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. A <b>suppliant</b> sinner seeking forgiveness.
supplicant	One praying humbly for something. <i>Supplicants prostrate themselves on the floor.</i>
supplicate	Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly. <i>He <b>supplicate</b>d the King for clemency.</i>



want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>He is <b>want</b>ed by the police in connection with an arms theft.</i>
W00	Try to gain the love of (someone), especially with a view to marriage. He <b>woo</b> ed her with quotes from Shakespeare.
