## Associations of "Begged" (30 Words)

<b>appeal</b>	Request earnestly (something from somebody); ask for aid or protection. <i>I <b>appealed</b> to his sense of justice.</i>
<b>asking</b>	The verbal act of requesting.
<b><u>beseech</u></b>	Ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat. <i>You have got to believe me Violet <b>beseech</b>ed him.</i>
<b>cadge</b>	Obtain or seek to obtain by cadging or wheedling. <i>He <b>cadged</b> fivers off old school friends.</i>
<b><u>conjure</u></b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>They hoped to <b>conjure</b> up the spirit of their dead friend.</i>
<b><u>crave</u></b>	Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for. <i>Will <b>craved</b> for family life.</i>
<b><u>desperately</u></b>	Used to emphasize the extreme degree of something. <i>The soil <b>desperately</b> needed potash.</i>
<b><u>entreat</u></b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>His friends <b>entreated</b> him not to go.</i>
<b>entreaty</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.</i>
<b>exhortation</b>	An address or communication emphatically urging someone to do something. <i><b>Exhortations</b> to consumers to switch off electrical appliances.</i>
<b>implore</b>	Beg someone earnestly or desperately to do something. <i>I <b>implore</b> mercy.</i>
<b><u>invitation</u></b>	A situation or action that tempts someone to do something or makes a particular outcome likely. <i>A club with membership by <b>invitation</b> only.</i>
<b>mendicant</b>	A member of a mendicant order. <i><b>Mendicant</b> friars.</i>

<b>necessary</b>	Determined, existing, or happening by natural laws or predestination; inevitable. <i>See when they need a tactful word of advice and do the <b>necessary</b>.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have or feel a need for. <i>They <b>need</b> to win tomorrow.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>petition</u></b>	Write a petition for something to somebody request formally and in writing. <i>The organization is <b>petitioning</b> the EU for a moratorium on the patent.</i>
<b><u>plea</u></b>	A formal statement by or on behalf of a defendant or prisoner, stating guilt or innocence in response to a charge, offering an allegation of fact, or claiming that a point of law should apply. <i>Her <b>plea</b> of a headache was not entirely false.</i>
<b><u>plead</u></b>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>She <b>pleaded</b> not guilty.</i>
<b><u>please</u></b>	Give satisfaction. <i>Would you like a drink Yes <b>please</b>.</i>
<b><u>pray</u></b>	Address a prayer to God or another deity. <i>Ladies and gentlemen <b>pray</b> be seated.</i>
<b>propitiate</b>	Win or regain the favour of (a god, spirit, or person) by doing something that pleases them. <i>The pagans thought it was important to <b>propitiate</b> the gods with sacrifices.</i>
<b>request</b>	A tune or song played on a radio programme typically accompanied by a personal message in response to a listener's request. <i>The computer is busy servicing <b>requests</b> from other processes.</i>
<b><u>solicit</u></b>	Make a solicitation or entreaty for something request urgently or persistently. <i>Historians and critics are <b>solicited</b> for opinions by the auction houses.</i>
<b><u>solicitation</u></b>	The act of asking for or trying to obtain something from someone. <i>He was a regular target for <b>solicitation</b> of funds.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i>A <b>suppliant</b> sinner seeking forgiveness.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	One praying humbly for something. <i><b>Suplicants</b> prostrate themselves on the floor.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly. <i>He <b>supplicated</b> the King for clemency.</i>

**woo**

Try to gain the love of (someone), especially with a view to marriage.  
*He **wooed** her with quotes from Shakespeare.*
