## Associations of "Behalf" (30 Words)

<b>advantage</b>	Give an advantage to. <i>He saw some <b>advantage</b> in the proposal.</i>
<b>assets</b>	Anything of material value or usefulness that is owned by a person or company.
<b>benefit</b>	Derive a benefit from. <i>The social season was highlighted by debutante balls and charity <b>benefits</b>.</i>
<b>boon</b>	A thing that is helpful or beneficial. <i>The route will be a <b>boon</b> to many travellers.</i>
<b>corporation</b>	A business firm whose articles of incorporation have been approved in some state. <i>Multinational <b>corporations</b>.</i>
<b>earnings</b>	Something that remunerates. <i>Export <b>earnings</b>.</i>
<b>emolument</b>	Compensation received by virtue of holding an office or having employment (usually in the form of wages or fees). <i>The directors <b>emoluments</b>.</i>
<b>expeditious</b>	Marked by speed and efficiency. <i>An <b>expeditious</b> investigation.</i>
<b>fund</b>	Provide a fund for the redemption of principal or payment of interest. <i>A concert to raise <b>funds</b> for the church.</i>
<b>income</b>	Money received, especially on a regular basis, for work or through investments. <i>He has a nice home and an adequate <b>income</b>.</i>
<b>lucre</b>	Informal terms for money. <i>Officials getting their hands grubby with filthy <b>lucre</b>.</i>
<b>maximize</b>	Make the best use of. <i>He <b>maximized</b> his role.</i>

<b>pecuniary</b>	Relating to or consisting of money. <i>He admitted obtaining a <b>pecuniary</b> advantage by deception.</i>
<b>perquisite</b>	An incidental benefit awarded for certain types of employment (especially if it is regarded as a right). <i>The <b>perquisites</b> of celebrity are intoxicating.</i>
<b><u>prerogative</u></b>	Arising from the prerogative of the Crown usually delegated to the government or the judiciary and based in common law rather than statutory law. <i>It is not a female <b>prerogative</b> to feel insecure.</i>
<b>privilege</b>	Bestow a privilege upon. <i>A breach of parliamentary <b>privilege</b>.</i>
<b>privileged</b>	Not subject to usual rules or penalties. <i>I felt I had been <b>privileged</b> to compete in such a race.</i>
<b>proceeds</b>	Money obtained from an event or activity. <i><b>Proceeds</b> from the event will go to aid the work of the charity.</i>
<b>profit</b>	Make a profit gain money or materially. <i>The company has not <b>profited</b> from the merger.</i>
<b>profitability</b>	The quality of affording gain or benefit or profit. <i>Growing sales and a return to <b>profitability</b>.</i>
<b><u>profitable</u></b>	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. <i>The investments were extremely <b>profitable</b>.</i>
<b>profiteer</b>	A person who profiteers. <i>A war <b>profiteer</b>.</i>
<b>remuneration</b>	Money paid for work or a service. <i>Adequate <b>remuneration</b> for his work.</i>
<b><u>sake</u></b>	Japanese alcoholic beverage made from fermented rice; usually served hot. <i>For your <b>sake</b>.</i>
<b><u>salary</u></b>	Pay a salary to. <i>A 15 per cent <b>salary</b> increase.</i>
<b><u>subsidy</u></b>	A sum of money granted by the state or a public body to help an industry or business keep the price of a commodity or service low. <i>A <b>subsidy</b> for research in artificial intelligence.</i>
<b>tariff</b>	Charge a tariff. <i>These services are <b>tariffed</b> by volume.</i>
<b>taxable</b>	(of goods or funds) subject to taxation. <i><b>Taxable</b> income.</i>

<b>wage</b>	Carry on (a war or campaign). <i><b>Wages</b> were paid by check.</i>
<b>welfare</b>	Financial support given to those who are unemployed or otherwise in need. <i>She lives on <b>welfare</b>.</i>
