hurried Done in a hurry; rushed.

I ate a **hurried** breakfast.

ideally Preferably; in an ideal world.

Her experience makes her **ideally** suited to the job.

modestly With modesty; in a modest manner.

Women are expected to dress **modestly**.

moralistic Narrowly and conventionally moral.

Modernized fairy tales are often **moralistic** and cleaned up.

politely In a respectful and considerate manner.

He waited **politely** for me to ask questions.

Represent fictitiously as in a play or pretend to be or act like.

She **pretend**ed a greater surprise than she felt.

**pretension** A claim or aspiration to a particular quality.

All that we cannot tolerate is **pretension** to infallibility.

**pretext** An artful or simulated semblance.

The rebels had the perfect **pretext** for making their move.

**prudery** Excessive or affected modesty.
