act	Take action do something. <i>He acted in Julius Caesar.</i>
action	Take action on deal with. <i>A man of action.</i>
become	Come into existence. <i>She wanted to become a doctor.</i>
comport	Conduct oneself; behave. <i>Articulate students who comported themselves well in interviews.</i>
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>In the second trial he conducted his own defence.</i>
courteously	In a polite manner.
deed	Convey or transfer property or rights by legal deed. <i>She had erred in both deed and manner.</i>
deign	Do something that one considers to be below one’s dignity. <i>She did not deign to answer the maid s question.</i>
demeanor	The way a person behaves toward other people.
dissemble	Hide under a false appearance. <i>An honest sincere person with no need to dissemble.</i>
do	Get something done. <i>Hi how are you doing today.</i>
ethology	The science of animal behaviour.
feign	Make believe with the intent to deceive. <i>She feigned nervousness.</i>
hasty	Excessively quick. <i>A hasty attempt to defuse the situation.</i>
headlong	Excessively quick. <i>Burst headlong through the gate.</i>

hurried	Done in a hurry; rushed. <i>I ate a hurried breakfast.</i>
ideally	Preferably; in an ideal world. <i>Her experience makes her ideally suited to the job.</i>
modestly	With modesty; in a modest manner. <i>Women are expected to dress modestly.</i>
moralistic	Narrowly and conventionally moral. <i>Modernized fairy tales are often moralistic and cleaned up.</i>
politely	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>He waited politely for me to ask questions.</i>
pretend	Represent fictitiously as in a play or pretend to be or act like. <i>She pretended a greater surprise than she felt.</i>
pretension	A claim or aspiration to a particular quality. <i>All that we cannot tolerate is pretension to infallibility.</i>
pretext	An artful or simulated semblance. <i>The rebels had the perfect pretext for making their move.</i>
prudery	Excessive or affected modesty.
prudish	Having or revealing a tendency to be easily shocked by matters relating to sex or nudity; excessively concerned with sexual propriety. <i>The prudish moral climate of the late 19th century.</i>
rashly	Without careful consideration of the possible consequences; impetuously. <i>Rashly Theresa accepts a second date with Tony.</i>
sham	Something that is a counterfeit; not what it seems to be. <i>He shammed a headache.</i>
simulate	Pretend to have or feel (an emotion). <i>Future population changes were simulated by computer.</i>
smatter	Work with in an amateurish manner. <i>She smatters Russian.</i>
