beast	An objectionable or unpleasant person or thing. <i>A wild beast.</i>
brute	A cruel or insensitive person. <i>He was a cold blooded brute.</i>
colossus	Someone or something that is abnormally large and powerful. <i>The Russian Empire was the colossus of European politics.</i>
giant	A person of exceptional talent or qualities. <i>Walton built a retail giant.</i>
goliath	Someone or something that is abnormally large and powerful.
heavyweight	A heavyweight boxer or other competitor. <i>A political heavyweight with national recognition.</i>
leviathan	The largest or most massive thing of its kind. <i>The great leviathans of the deep.</i>

mammoth	A large extinct elephant of the Pleistocene epoch, typically hairy with a sloping back and long curved tusks.
monster	An imaginary creature usually having various human and animal parts. <i>A world of fable inhabited by other worldly monsters.</i>
monstrosity	The state or fact of being monstrous. <i>They regarded the atom bomb as a monstrosity.</i>
mountain	A large pile or quantity of something. <i>A mountain peak.</i>
titan	A person of exceptional importance and reputation. <i>A titan of American industry.</i>

Usage Examples of "Behemoth" as a noun

- *Shoppers are now more loyal to their local shops than to faceless behemoths.*
- *Behemoths like the brontosaurus.*

anteater	A burrowing monotreme mammal covered with spines and having a long snout and claws for hunting ants and termites; native to Australia.
beast	A living organism characterized by voluntary movement. <i>A scheming manipulative little beast.</i>
boulder	A town in north central Colorado; Rocky Mountains resort center and university town.
brute	A savagely violent person or animal. <i>He was a cold blooded brute.</i>
colossal	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>Colossal crumbling ruins of an ancient temple.</i>
colossus	A person or thing of enormous size, importance, or ability. <i>The Russian Empire was the colossus of European politics.</i>
demon	A forceful or skilful performer of a specified activity. <i>Each of the damned souls was guarded by a group of hideous demons.</i>
devil	Harass or worry (someone). <i>Casting out devils.</i>

dragon	A mythical monster like a giant reptile In European tradition the dragon is typically fire breathing and tends to symbolize chaos or evil whereas in East Asia it is usually a beneficent symbol of fertility associated with water and the heavens. <i>The geography teacher was a real dragon.</i>
elephantine	Of, resembling, or characteristic of an elephant or elephants, especially in being large, clumsy, or awkward. <i>There was an elephantine thud from the bathroom.</i>
enormous	Extraordinarily large in size or extent or amount or power or degree. <i>The possibilities are enormous.</i>
gargantuan	Of great mass; huge and bulky. <i>A gargantuan appetite.</i>
gargoyle	A spout that terminates in a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.
giant	Used in names of very large animals and plants e g giant hogweed giant tortoise. <i>A giant among sportsmen.</i>
<u>gigantic</u>	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>Gigantic disappointment.</i>
gnome	A small ugly person. <i>A grizzled gnome of a man.</i>
hydra	Trouble that cannot be overcome by a single effort because of its many aspects or its persistent and pervasive quality. <i>We may be facing a hydra that defies any easy solution.</i>
leviathan	An autocratic monarch or state. <i>It was a leviathan among redwoods.</i>
mammoth	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>A mammoth ship.</i>
massive	Imposing in scale or scope or degree or power. <i>Moore s massive sculptures.</i>
monolith	A very large and characterless building. <i>The 72 storey monolith overlooking the waterfront.</i>
monster	A congenitally malformed or mutant animal or plant. <i>He was an unfeeling treacherous monster.</i>
ogre	A giant who likes to eat human beings. <i>It is clear that I am no ogre.</i>
serpent	A firework that moves in serpentine manner when ignited. <i>Fire breathing flying serpents.</i>

- sinology** The study of Chinese history and language and culture.
- snake** Form a snake like pattern.
*The river **snakes** through the valley.*
- stone** A large flat table or sheet originally made of stone and now usually of metal on which pages of type are made up.
*I weighed 10 **stone**.*
- tower** Anything that approximates the shape of a column or tower.
*The south west **tower** is a wonderful example of late Gothic.*
- troll** A fisherman s lure that is used in trolling.
*He used a spinner as his **troll**.*
- viper** Venomous Old World snakes characterized by hollow venom-conducting fangs in the upper jaw.
