<b>beast</b>	An objectionable or unpleasant person or thing. <i>A wild <b>beast</b>.</i>
<b>brute</b>	A cruel or insensitive person. <i>He was a cold blooded <b>brute</b>.</i>
<b>colossus</b>	Someone or something that is abnormally large and powerful. <i>The Russian Empire was the <b>colossus</b> of European politics.</i>
<b>giant</b>	A person of exceptional talent or qualities. <i>Walton built a retail <b>giant</b>.</i>
<b>goliath</b>	Someone or something that is abnormally large and powerful.
<b>heavyweight</b>	A heavyweight boxer or other competitor. <i>A political <b>heavyweight</b> with national recognition.</i>
<b>leviathan</b>	The largest or most massive thing of its kind. <i>The great <b>leviathans</b> of the deep.</i>

<b>mammoth</b>	A large extinct elephant of the Pleistocene epoch, typically hairy with a sloping back and long curved tusks.
<b>monster</b>	An imaginary creature usually having various human and animal parts. <i>A world of fable inhabited by other worldly <b>monsters</b>.</i>
<b>monstrosity</b>	The state or fact of being monstrous. <i>They regarded the atom bomb as a <b>monstrosity</b>.</i>
<b>mountain</b>	A large pile or quantity of something. <i>A <b>mountain</b> peak.</i>
<b>titan</b>	A person of exceptional importance and reputation. <i>A <b>titan</b> of American industry.</i>

<b>anteater</b>	A burrowing monotreme mammal covered with spines and having a long snout and claws for hunting ants and termites; native to Australia.
<b>beast</b>	A living organism characterized by voluntary movement. <i>A scheming manipulative little <b>beast</b>.</i>
<b>boulder</b>	A town in north central Colorado; Rocky Mountains resort center and university town.
<b>brute</b>	A savagely violent person or animal. <i>He was a cold blooded <b>brute</b>.</i>
<b>colossal</b>	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i><b>Colossal</b> crumbling ruins of an ancient temple.</i>
<b>colossus</b>	A person or thing of enormous size, importance, or ability. <i>The Russian Empire was the <b>colossus</b> of European politics.</i>
<b>demon</b>	A forceful or skilful performer of a specified activity. <i>Each of the damned souls was guarded by a group of hideous <b>demons</b>.</i>
<b>devil</b>	Harass or worry (someone). <i>Casting out <b>devils</b>.</i>

<b>dragon</b>	<p>A mythical monster like a giant reptile In European tradition the dragon is typically fire breathing and tends to symbolize chaos or evil whereas in East Asia it is usually a beneficent symbol of fertility associated with water and the heavens.</p> <p><i>The geography teacher was a real <b>dragon</b>.</i></p>
<b>elephantine</b>	<p>Of, resembling, or characteristic of an elephant or elephants, especially in being large, clumsy, or awkward.</p> <p><i>There was an <b>elephantine</b> thud from the bathroom.</i></p>
<b>enormous</b>	<p>Extraordinarily large in size or extent or amount or power or degree.</p> <p><i>The possibilities are <b>enormous</b>.</i></p>
<b>gargantuan</b>	<p>Of great mass; huge and bulky.</p> <p><i>A <b>gargantuan</b> appetite.</i></p>
<b>gargoyle</b>	<p>A spout that terminates in a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.</p>
<b>giant</b>	<p>Used in names of very large animals and plants e g giant hogweed giant tortoise.</p> <p><i>A <b>giant</b> among sportsmen.</i></p>
<b><u>gigantic</u></b>	<p>So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth.</p> <p><i><b>Gigantic</b> disappointment.</i></p>
<b>gnome</b>	<p>A small ugly person.</p> <p><i>A grizzled <b>gnome</b> of a man.</i></p>
<b>hydra</b>	<p>Trouble that cannot be overcome by a single effort because of its many aspects or its persistent and pervasive quality.</p> <p><i>We may be facing a <b>hydra</b> that defies any easy solution.</i></p>
<b>leviathan</b>	<p>An autocratic monarch or state.</p> <p><i>It was a <b>leviathan</b> among redwoods.</i></p>
<b>mammoth</b>	<p>So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth.</p> <p><i>A <b>mammoth</b> ship.</i></p>
<b>massive</b>	<p>Imposing in scale or scope or degree or power.</p> <p><i>Moore s <b>massive</b> sculptures.</i></p>
<b>monolith</b>	<p>A very large and characterless building.</p> <p><i>The 72 storey <b>monolith</b> overlooking the waterfront.</i></p>
<b>monster</b>	<p>A congenitally malformed or mutant animal or plant.</p> <p><i>He was an unfeeling treacherous <b>monster</b>.</i></p>
<b>ogre</b>	<p>A giant who likes to eat human beings.</p> <p><i>It is clear that I am no <b>ogre</b>.</i></p>
<b>serpent</b>	<p>A firework that moves in serpentine manner when ignited.</p> <p><i>Fire breathing flying <b>serpents</b>.</i></p>

<b>sinology</b>	The study of Chinese history and language and culture.
<b>snake</b>	Form a snake like pattern. <i>The river <b>snakes</b> through the valley.</i>
<b><u>stone</u></b>	A large flat table or sheet originally made of stone and now usually of metal on which pages of type are made up. <i>I weighed 10 <b>stone</b>.</i>
<b><u>tower</u></b>	Anything that approximates the shape of a column or tower. <i>The south west <b>tower</b> is a wonderful example of late Gothic.</i>
<b><u>troll</u></b>	A fisherman s lure that is used in trolling. <i>He used a spinner as his <b>troll</b>.</i>
<b>viper</b>	Venomous Old World snakes characterized by hollow venom-conducting fangs in the upper jaw.
