- *See with attention.*
- *See or observe (someone or something, especially of remarkable or impressive nature).*



## Synonyms of "Behold" as a verb (17 Words)

- contemplate** Have in view as a probable intention.  
*He **contemplated** his image in the mirrors.*
- eye** Look at someone in a way that reveals a particular, especially sexual, interest.  
*Rose **eyed** him warily.*
- gaze at** Look at with fixed eyes.
- gaze upon** Look at with fixed eyes.
- inspect** Look over carefully.  
*Customs officers came aboard to **inspect** our documents.*
- lay eyes on** Prepare or position for action or operation.
- look** Look forward to the probable occurrence of.  
*He just didn't **look** himself at all.*
- look at** Be oriented in a certain direction, often with respect to another reference point; be opposite to.

<b><u>observe</u></b>	Observe with care or pay close attention to. <i>The behaviour <b>observed</b> in groups of chimpanzees.</i>
<b>regard</b>	(of a thing) relate to; concern. <i>If these things <b>regarded</b> only myself I could stand it with composure.</i>
<b><u>scan</u></b>	Conform to a metrical pattern. <i>I <b>scanned</b> through the reference materials.</i>
<b><u>see</u></b>	Go to see for professional or business reasons. <i>The minister doesn't <b>see</b> anybody before noon.</i>
<b>stare at</b>	Fixate one's eyes.
<b><u>survey</u></b>	Make a survey of for statistical purposes. <i>I <b>surveyed</b> the options.</i>
<b>view</b>	Regard in a particular light or with a particular attitude. <i><b>View</b> an exhibition.</i>
<b><u>watch</u></b>	See or watch. <i>You should <b>watch</b> what you say.</i>
<b>witness</b>	Be a witness to. <i>One of the purposes of his coming was to nerve the disciples to <b>witness</b> to Jesus.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Behold" as a verb

- *Behold your lord and prince!*
- *The botanical gardens were a wonder to behold.*
- *Behold Christ!*



## Associations of "Behold" (30 Words)

- aesthetics** The branch of philosophy which deals with questions of beauty and artistic taste.  
*Traditional **aesthetics** assumed the existence of universal and timeless criteria of artistic value.*
- eye** A rounded eye like marking on an animal such as those on the tail of a peacock an eyespot.  
*Withered potatoes sprouting at the **eyes**.*
- look** An expression of a feeling or thought by looking.  
*A **look** of triumph.*
- lookout** Used to indicate whether a likely outcome is good or bad.  
*A **lookout** point with breathtaking views.*
- macroscopic** Visible to the naked eye; not microscopic.

<b>microscopy</b>	The use of the microscope.
<b>observe</b>	Observe with care or pay close attention to. <i>She <b>observed</b> that all the chairs were already occupied.</i>
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>ocular</b>	Visible- Shakespeare. <b>Ocular</b> muscles.
<b>oculist</b>	A person skilled in testing for defects of vision in order to prescribe corrective glasses. <i>He visited an <b>oculist</b> in Chicago who prescribed a pair of reading glasses.</i>
<b>optic</b>	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>The <b>optic</b> or <b>optical</b> axis of the eye.</i>
<b>optical</b>	(of a device) requiring electromagnetic radiation for its operation. <i>He pushed his <b>opticals</b> on to the bridge of his nose.</i>
<b>optician</b>	A person qualified to prescribe and dispense glasses and contact lenses and to detect eye diseases ophthalmic optician or to make and supply glasses and contact lenses dispensing optician.
<b>optometrist</b>	A person who practises optometry.
<b>pageant</b>	A rich and spectacular ceremony. <i>It s all part of life s rich <b>pageant</b>.</i>
<b>perceptual</b>	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. <i>A patient with <b>perceptual</b> problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<b>prosthetics</b>	The branch of medicine dealing with the production and use of artificial body parts.
<b>see</b>	See or watch. <i>I could <b>see</b> through the windows.</i>
<b>seeing</b>	The action of seeing someone or something. <i>He had given the <b>seeing</b> as fair.</i>
<b>sensory</b>	Involving or derived from the senses. <i>The <b>sensory</b> cortex.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Catch sight of to perceive with the eyes. <i>John was a familiar <b>sight</b> in the bar for many years.</i>
<b>spectacle</b>	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The show is pure <b>spectacle</b>.</i>
<b>spectacular</b>	Characteristic of spectacles or drama. <i>The party suffered a <b>spectacular</b> loss in the election.</i>

- splendor** A quality that outshines the usual.  
*It is the university that gives the scene its stately **splendor**.*
- telescopic** Visible only with a telescope.  
*A **telescopic** antenna.*
- visibility** Capability of providing a clear unobstructed view.  
*That candidate does not have sufficient **visibility** to win an election.*
- visible** Visible imports or exports.  
***Visible** resources.*
- vision** The images seen on a television screen.  
*We **visioned** a small lawn surrounded with a perfect tangle of trees.*
- visual** Relating to or using sight.  
*A **visual** image.*
- watch** The officers and crew on duty during a watch.  
*There aren't enough staff to **watch** him properly.*
