### **Definitions of "Beholder" as a noun**

### Synonyms of "Beholder" as a noun (3 Words)

**observer** A person who follows events closely and comments publicly on them.  
*Some **observers** expect interest rates to rise.*

**perceiver** A person who becomes aware (of things or events) through the senses.

**percipient** A person who becomes aware (of things or events) through the senses.

**alibi**

Exonerate by means of an alibi.  
*Her friend agreed to **alibi** her.*

**behold**

See with attention.  
**Behold** Christ.

**blindly**

Without understanding or using one's judgement; unthinkingly.  
*Don't **blindly** accept dogma as justification.*

**commentator**

A writer who reports and analyzes events of the day.  
***Commentators** noted that the demonstration was part of a wider strategy.*

**discerning**

Having or showing good judgement.  
*A **discerning** editor.*

<b>experimenter</b>	A person who performs a scientific procedure, especially in a laboratory, to determine something. <i>Each participant was tested by a trained <b>experimenter</b>.</i>
<b>eye</b>	The region of the face surrounding the eyes. <i>Withered potatoes sprouting at the <b>eyes</b>.</i>
<b>find</b>	Get or find back recover the use of. <i><b>Find</b> the product of two numbers.</i>
<b>floodlight</b>	Illuminate a building or outdoor area with floodlights. <i>We are <b>floodlighting</b> the building to highlight the structure.</i>
<b>grandstand</b>	Of a view seen from an advantageous position as if from a grandstand. <i>He <b>grandstanded</b> about how we were jeopardizing national security.</i>
<b>insight</b>	An accurate and deep understanding. <i>His mind soared to previously unattainable heights of <b>insight</b>.</i>
<b>macroscopic</b>	Visible to the naked eye; using the naked eye.
<b>observer</b>	A person posted in an official capacity to an area to monitor political or military events. <i>Some <b>observers</b> expect interest rates to rise.</i>
<b>oculist</b>	A medical doctor specializing in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the eye. <i>He visited an <b>oculist</b> in Chicago who prescribed a pair of reading glasses.</i>
<b>offstage</b>	Situated or taking place in the area of a stage not visible to the audience. <i>She walked away as the clear winner of both onstage and <b>offstage</b> dancing.</i>
<b>participant</b>	A person who takes part in something. <i>Staff are to be active <b>participants</b> in the decision making process.</i>
<b>percipient</b>	A person who becomes aware (of things or events) through the senses. <i>A <b>percipient</b> author.</i>
<b>perjure</b>	Wilfully tell an untruth or make a misrepresentation under oath; commit perjury. <i>She admitted that she had <b>perjured</b> herself.</i>
<b>player</b>	An important participant (as in a business deal). <i>An MP3 <b>player</b>.</i>
<b>see</b>	See or watch. <i>It has to be the answer don t you <b>see</b>.</i>
<b>seeing</b>	The action of seeing someone or something. <i>He had given the <b>seeing</b> as fair.</i>

<b>shortsightedness</b>	(ophthalmology) eyesight abnormality resulting from the eye's faulty refractive ability; distant objects appear blurred.
<b>sightless</b>	Invisible. <i>Blank <b>sightless</b> eyes.</i>
<b>soundproof</b>	Make (a room or building) resistant to the passage of sound. <i>The rehearsal room s well <b>soundproofed</b>.</i>
<b>spectator</b>	A close observer; someone who looks at something (such as an exhibition of some kind. <i>Around fifteen thousand <b>spectators</b> came to watch the thrills and spills.</i>
<b>telescopic</b>	Having or consisting of concentric tubular sections designed to slide into one another. <i><b>Telescopic</b> observations.</i>
<b>unseen</b>	An unseen passage for translation. <i><b>Unseen</b> forces at work.</i>
<b>viewer</b>	A close observer; someone who looks at something (such as an exhibition of some kind. <i>Television <b>viewers</b>.</i>
<b>visibility</b>	Quality or fact or degree of being visible; perceptible by the eye or obvious to the eye. <i>That candidate does not have sufficient <b>visibility</b> to win an election.</i>
<b>witness</b>	Be a witness to. <i>One of the purposes of his coming was to nerve the disciples to <b>witness</b> to Jesus.</i>
