augur	Predict from an omen. <i>The end of the cold war seemed to augur well.</i>
<u>augury</u>	A sign of what will happen in the future; an omen. <i>They heard the sound as an augury of death.</i>
bode	Be a portent of a particular outcome. <i>These signs bode bad news.</i>
boding	A feeling of evil to come. <i>A steadily escalating sense of foreboding.</i>
circumstances	Your overall circumstances or condition in life including everything that happens to you. <i>A victim of circumstances.</i>
democratic	Belong to or relating to the Democratic Party. <i>Democratic art forms.</i>
<u>elective</u>	A course that the student can select from among alternatives. <i>Elective courses on this subject have always been oversubscribed.</i>
elector	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered electors voted.</i>
fateful	Having momentous consequences; of decisive importance- Saturday Rev. <i>A fateful oversight.</i>
<u>foreboding</u>	Implying that something bad is going to happen. <i>A steadily escalating sense of foreboding.</i>
harbinger	Something that precedes and indicates the approach of something or someone. <i>These works were not yet opera but they were the most important harbinger of opera.</i>
indication	A reading given by a gauge or meter. <i>The presence of bacterial infection was an indication for the use of antibiotics.</i>

leader	The principal player in a music group. <i>A natural leader.</i>
luck	Something regarded as bringing about or portending good or bad things. <i>It was my good luck to be there.</i>
omen	Indicate as with a sign or an omen. <i>The raven seemed a bird of evil omen.</i>
ominous	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>Ominous rumblings of discontent.</i>
portend	Indicate by signs. <i>The eclipses portend some major events.</i>
portent	A sign of something about to happen. <i>What portent can be greater than a pious notary.</i>
portentous	Of momentous or ominous significance- Herman Melville. <i>The author s portentous moralizings.</i>
premonition	An early warning about a future event. <i>He had a premonition of imminent disaster.</i>
presentiment	A feeling of evil to come. <i>The lawyer had a presentiment that the judge would dismiss the case.</i>
presidential	Relating to a president or presidency. <i>America wants a president who looks presidential.</i>
prognostication	Knowledge of the future (usually said to be obtained from a divine source). <i>An unprecedented amount of soul searching and prognostication.</i>
prophetic	Relating to or characteristic of a prophet or prophecy. <i>The prophetic books of the Old Testament.</i>
sign	Authorize a document or other written or printed material by attaching a signature. <i>I didn t see the Stop sign.</i>
status	Relative social or professional position; standing. <i>The novel attained the status of a classic.</i>
superstition	Excessively credulous belief in and reverence for the supernatural. <i>She touched her locket for luck a superstition she d had since childhood.</i>
threatening	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>Her mother had received a threatening letter.</i>
unpropitious	Not propitious. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially unpropitious time.</i>
