## Associations of "Bellwether" (30 Words)

<b>augur</b>	Predict from an omen. <i>The end of the cold war seemed to <b>augur</b> well.</i>
<b><a href="#">augury</a></b>	A sign of what will happen in the future; an omen. <i>They heard the sound as an <b>augury</b> of death.</i>
<b>bode</b>	Be a portent of a particular outcome. <i>These signs <b>bode</b> bad news.</i>
<b>boding</b>	A feeling of evil to come. <i>A steadily escalating sense of fore<b>boding</b>.</i>
<b>circumstances</b>	Your overall circumstances or condition in life including everything that happens to you. <i>A victim of <b>circumstances</b>.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	Belong to or relating to the Democratic Party. <i><b>Democratic</b> art forms.</i>
<b><a href="#">elective</a></b>	A course that the student can select from among alternatives. <i><b>Elective</b> courses on this subject have always been oversubscribed.</i>
<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>
<b>fateful</b>	Having momentous consequences; of decisive importance- Saturday Rev. <i>A <b>fateful</b> oversight.</i>
<b><a href="#">foreboding</a></b>	Implying that something bad is going to happen. <i>A steadily escalating sense of fore<b>boding</b>.</i>
<b>harbinger</b>	Something that precedes and indicates the approach of something or someone. <i>These works were not yet opera but they were the most important <b>harbinger</b> of opera.</i>
<b>indication</b>	A reading given by a gauge or meter. <i>The presence of bacterial infection was an <b>indication</b> for the use of antibiotics.</i>

<b>leader</b>	The principal player in a music group. <i>A natural <b>leader</b>.</i>
<b>luck</b>	Something regarded as bringing about or portending good or bad things. <i>It was my good <b>luck</b> to be there.</i>
<b>omen</b>	Indicate as with a sign or an omen. <i>The raven seemed a bird of evil <b>omen</b>.</i>
<b>ominous</b>	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i><b>Ominous</b> rumblings of discontent.</i>
<b>portend</b>	Indicate by signs. <i>The eclipses <b>portend</b> some major events.</i>
<b>portent</b>	A sign of something about to happen. <i>What <b>portent</b> can be greater than a pious notary.</i>
<b>portentous</b>	Of momentous or ominous significance- Herman Melville. <i>The author s <b>portentous</b> moralizings.</i>
<b>premonition</b>	An early warning about a future event. <i>He had a <b>premonition</b> of imminent disaster.</i>
<b>presentiment</b>	A feeling of evil to come. <i>The lawyer had a <b>presentiment</b> that the judge would dismiss the case.</i>
<b>presidential</b>	Relating to a president or presidency. <i>America wants a president who looks <b>presidential</b>.</i>
<b>prognostication</b>	Knowledge of the future (usually said to be obtained from a divine source). <i>An unprecedented amount of soul searching and <b>prognostication</b>.</i>
<b>prophetic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a prophet or prophecy. <i>The <b>prophetic</b> books of the Old Testament.</i>
<b>sign</b>	Authorize a document or other written or printed material by attaching a signature. <i>I didn t see the Stop <b>sign</b>.</i>
<b>status</b>	Relative social or professional position; standing. <i>The novel attained the <b>status</b> of a classic.</i>
<b>superstition</b>	Excessively credulous belief in and reverence for the supernatural. <i>She touched her locket for luck a <b>superstition</b> she d had since childhood.</i>
<b>threatening</b>	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>Her mother had received a <b>threatening</b> letter.</i>
<b>unpropitious</b>	Not propitious. <i>His reports were submitted at a financially <b>unpropitious</b> time.</i>
