## Associations of "Belonged" (30 Words)

<b>accommodate</b>	Be agreeable or acceptable to. <i>The cottages <b>accommodate</b> up to six people.</i>
<b>await</b>	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>An eagerly <b>awaited</b> debut.</i>
<b>awning</b>	A canopy made of canvas to shelter people or things from rain or sun.
<b>benefit</b>	Be appropriate for; suit. <i>As <b>benefits</b> a Quaker he was a humane man.</i>
<b><a href="#">bind</a></b>	Provide with a binding. <i>We have many ties that <b>bind</b> us historical cultural and economical.</i>
<b><a href="#">carry</a></b>	The act of carrying something. <i>The product does not <b>carry</b> the swallow symbol.</i>
<b><a href="#">cling</a></b>	A clingstone peach. <i>Sucker like discs help them to <b>cling</b> on.</i>
<b>contain</b>	Contain or hold have within. <i>He must <b>contain</b> his hatred.</i>
<b>detention</b>	A state of being confined (usually for a short time). <i>Teachers were divided as to the effectiveness of <b>detention</b>.</i>
<b>embrace</b>	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>The two <b>embraced</b> holding each other tightly.</i>
<b>encompass</b>	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>This group <b>encompasses</b> a wide range of people from different backgrounds.</i>
<b>entangle</b>	Twist together or entwine into a confusing mass. <i>The child <b>entangled</b> the cord.</i>

<b>gnash</b>	Grind together, of teeth. <i>No doubt he is <b>gnashing</b> his teeth in rage.</i>
<b>grab</b>	Take hold of so as to seize or restrain or stop the motion of. <i>The brakes <b>grabbed</b> very badly.</i>
<b>grasp</b>	The act of grasping. <i>The child slipped from her <b>grasp</b>.</i>
<b>grip</b>	To grip or seize as in a wrestling match. <i>In Britain they call a bobby pin a <b>grip</b>.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have gained a qualification. <i>You don't <b>have</b> to accept this situation.</i>
<b>hold</b>	A stronghold. <i>I can <b>hold</b> my drink as well as anyone.</i>
<b>implicate</b>	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>He is <b>implicated</b> in the scheme to defraud the government.</i>
<b>impound</b>	Shut up (domestic animals) in a pound or enclosure. <i>Almost forgotten were the poor unfortunates <b>impounded</b> in the prison.</i>
<b>include</b>	Have as a part, be made up out of. <i>The price <b>includes</b> dinner bed and breakfast.</i>
<b>let</b>	A property available for rent. <i><b>Let</b> A and B stand for X and Y respectively.</i>
<b>maintenance</b>	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>Essential <b>maintenance</b> work.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have something as one's own possess. <i>I was an outcast among my <b>own</b> kind.</i>
<b>possess</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>I tried to <b>possess</b> my soul in patience.</i>
<b>postponement</b>	Act of putting off to a future time. <i>The <b>postponement</b> of the elections.</i>
<b>retain</b>	Allow to remain in a place or position or maintain a property or feature. <i>This garment <b>retains</b> its shape even after many washings.</i>
<b>retention</b>	The fact of keeping something in one's memory. <i>The <b>retention</b> of direct control by central government.</i>
<b>take</b>	Take somebody somewhere. <i>His own whimsical <b>take</b> on life.</i>
