accommodate	Be agreeable or acceptable to. <i>The cottages accommodate up to six people.</i>
await	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>An eagerly awaited debut.</i>
awning	A canopy made of canvas to shelter people or things from rain or sun.
benefit	Be appropriate for; suit. <i>As benefits a Quaker he was a humane man.</i>
bind	Provide with a binding. <i>We have many ties that bind us historical cultural and economical.</i>
carry	The act of carrying something. <i>The product does not carry the swallow symbol.</i>
cling	A clingstone peach. <i>Sucker like discs help them to cling on.</i>
contain	Contain or hold have within. <i>He must contain his hatred.</i>
detention	A state of being confined (usually for a short time). <i>Teachers were divided as to the effectiveness of detention.</i>
embrace	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>The two embraced holding each other tightly.</i>
encompass	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>This group encompasses a wide range of people from different backgrounds.</i>
entangle	Twist together or entwine into a confusing mass. <i>The child entangled the cord.</i>

gnash	Grind together, of teeth. <i>No doubt he is gnashing his teeth in rage.</i>
grab	Take hold of so as to seize or restrain or stop the motion of. <i>The brakes grabbed very badly.</i>
grasp	The act of grasping. <i>The child slipped from her grasp.</i>
grip	To grip or seize as in a wrestling match. <i>In Britain they call a bobby pin a grip.</i>
have	Have gained a qualification. <i>You don't have to accept this situation.</i>
hold	A stronghold. <i>I can hold my drink as well as anyone.</i>
implicate	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>He is implicated in the scheme to defraud the government.</i>
impound	Shut up (domestic animals) in a pound or enclosure. <i>Almost forgotten were the poor unfortunates impounded in the prison.</i>
include	Have as a part, be made up out of. <i>The price includes dinner bed and breakfast.</i>
let	A property available for rent. <i>Let A and B stand for X and Y respectively.</i>
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>Essential maintenance work.</i>
own	Have something as one's own possess. <i>I was an outcast among my own kind.</i>
possess	Have ownership or possession of. <i>I tried to possess my soul in patience.</i>
postponement	Act of putting off to a future time. <i>The postponement of the elections.</i>
retain	Allow to remain in a place or position or maintain a property or feature. <i>This garment retains its shape even after many washings.</i>
retention	The fact of keeping something in one's memory. <i>The retention of direct control by central government.</i>
take	Take somebody somewhere. <i>His own whimsical take on life.</i>

tie

Hold together by a crosspiece or tie.
