dearest	Used as an affectionate form of address. <i>You make me so happy dearest.</i>
<u>girlfriend</u>	A woman's female friend. <i>She would rather go to the cinema with a girlfriend.</i>
honey	Any sweet substance similar to bees honey. <i>Her honey skin.</i>
inamorata	A person's female lover. <i>His new inamorata is a twenty two year old mannequin named Jennifer.</i>
inamorato	A person's male lover. <i>Her days were spent dallying with her inamorato.</i>
lady friend	A woman of the peerage in Britain.
lady love	A woman of refinement.
love	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>They were both in love with her.</i>
loved one	A beloved person; used as terms of endearment.
<u>lover</u>	A person who likes or enjoys a specified thing. <i>Music lovers.</i>
man friend	Someone who serves in the armed forces; a member of a military force.
<u>sweetheart</u>	A very attractive or seductive looking woman. <i>Don t worry sweetheart I ve got it all worked out.</i>
woman friend	Women as a class.
<u>worshipper</u>	A person who feels great admiration or devotion for someone or something. <i>Three thousand worshippers attend the mosque.</i>
young lady	English poet (1683-1765).
young man	United States film and television actress (1913-2000).

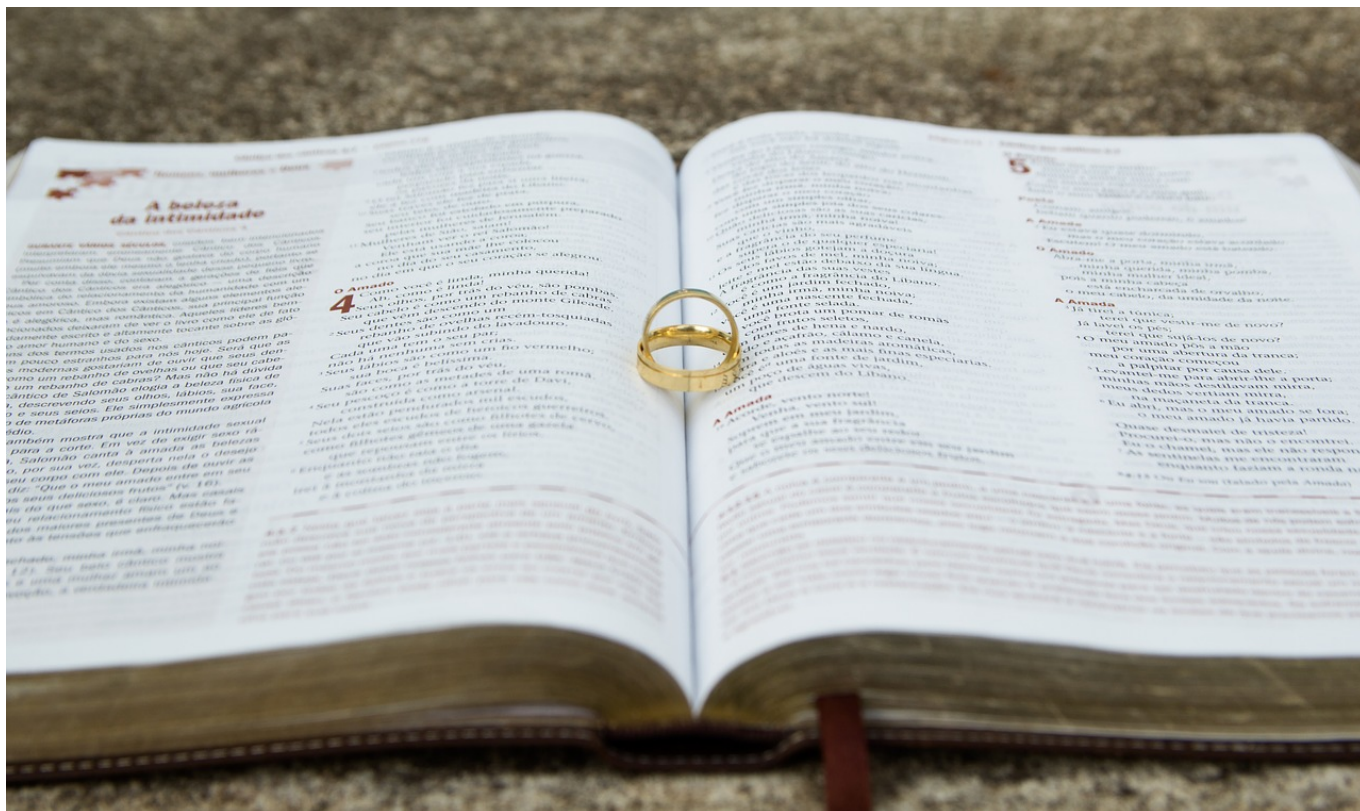

Synonyms of "Beloved" as an adjective (19 Words)

admired	Regarded with admiration.
adored	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god). <i>Adored grandchildren.</i>
cherished	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>A cherished friend.</i>
<u>darling</u>	Dearly loved. <i>His darling wife.</i>
<u>dear</u>	Endearing sweet. <i>One s dearest wish.</i>
dearest	Dearly loved. <i>One of my dearest friends.</i>

esteemed	Held in great respect; admired. <i>Our esteemed leader.</i>
<u>exalted</u>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>An exalted ideal.</i>
favourite	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>Their favourite Italian restaurant.</i>
idolized	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god). <i>An idolized wife.</i>
liked	Conforming in every respect. <i>A well liked teacher.</i>
loved	Held dear. <i>His loved companion of many years.</i>
much loved	Great in quantity or degree or extent.
precious	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>My time s precious.</i>
<u>prized</u>	Extremely highly valued. <i>The bicycle was her most prized possession.</i>
revered	Profoundly honored. <i>Revered holy men.</i>
<u>treasured</u>	Highly valued; prized. <i>A treasured heirloom.</i>
valued	Held in great esteem for admirable qualities especially of an intrinsic nature. <i>Triple valued.</i>
<u>worshipped</u>	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god).

affection	A condition or disease. <i>She felt affection for the wise old lady.</i>
agape	With the mouth wide open as in wonder or awe. <i>With mouth agape.</i>
amity	A cordial disposition. <i>The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than amity.</i>
attachment	A supplementary part or accessory. <i>The students are placed on attachment to schools for one day a week.</i>
brethren	Fellow Christians or members of a male religious order. <i>Our brethren in the popular press.</i>

conjugal	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple. <i>Conjugal visits.</i>
connubial	In a conjugal manner. <i>Connubial bliss.</i>
consummate	Perfect and complete in every respect; having all necessary qualities. <i>The property sale is consummated.</i>
cordiality	A cordial disposition.
<u>darling</u>	(in affected use) pretty; charming. <i>A darling little pillbox hat.</i>
<u>dear</u>	A sweet or endearing person. <i>Five pounds that s a bit dear.</i>
dearly	In a sincere and heartfelt manner. <i>Freedom to worship our religion has been bought dearly.</i>
enthusiast	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car enthusiast.</i>
favorite	Something regarded with special favor or liking. <i>That book is one of my favorites.</i>
<u>fondly</u>	With affection or liking. <i>She spoke to her children fondly.</i>
<u>friendship</u>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>This is an ideal group for finding support and friendship.</i>
heterosexual	A heterosexual person. <i>Heterosexual relationships.</i>
<u>husband</u>	Use (resources) economically. <i>She husbanded their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
interest	Excite the curiosity of engage the interest of. <i>In the common interest.</i>
kiss	Used to express affection at the end of a letter (conventionally represented by the letter X). <i>She kissed her grandfather on the forehead when she entered the room.</i>
matrimony	The state of being married; marriage. <i>The joys of matrimony.</i>
moll	The girlfriend of a gangster. <i>I d rush the money over to his moll.</i>
<u>paramour</u>	A lover, especially the illicit partner of a married person.
philander	Talk or behave amorously, without serious intentions. <i>Married men who philander.</i>

platonic	(of love or friendship) intimate and affectionate but not sexual. <i>Platonic love.</i>
popular	Liked or admired by many people or by a particular person or group. <i>A democratic or popular movement.</i>
<u>romance</u>	The group of languages derived from Latin. <i>A holiday romance.</i>
sisterhood	The relationship between sisters. <i>Much of sisterhood is about sharing lipsticks.</i>
<u>unrequited</u>	(of a feeling, especially love) not returned. <i>He s been pining with unrequited love.</i>
