- darling** A lovable or endearing person.  
*Good night **darling**.*
- dear** A sweet or endearing person.  
*Don't you worry **dear**.*
- dear one** A beloved person; used as terms of endearment.

<b>dearest</b>	Used as an affectionate form of address. <i>You make me so happy <b>dearest</b>.</i>
<b><u>girlfriend</u></b>	A woman's female friend. <i>She would rather go to the cinema with a <b>girlfriend</b>.</i>
<b>honey</b>	Any sweet substance similar to bees honey. <i>Her <b>honey</b> skin.</i>
<b>inamorata</b>	A person's female lover. <i>His new <b>inamorata</b> is a twenty two year old mannequin named Jennifer.</i>
<b>inamorato</b>	A person's male lover. <i>Her days were spent dallying with her <b>inamorato</b>.</i>
<b>lady friend</b>	A woman of the peerage in Britain.
<b>lady love</b>	A woman of refinement.
<b>love</b>	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>They were both in <b>love</b> with her.</i>
<b>loved one</b>	A beloved person; used as terms of endearment.
<b><u>lover</u></b>	A person who likes or enjoys a specified thing. <i>Music <b>lovers</b>.</i>
<b>man friend</b>	Someone who serves in the armed forces; a member of a military force.
<b><u>sweetheart</u></b>	A very attractive or seductive looking woman. <i>Don t worry <b>sweetheart</b> I ve got it all worked out.</i>
<b>woman friend</b>	Women as a class.
<b><u>worshipper</u></b>	A person who feels great admiration or devotion for someone or something. <i>Three thousand <b>worshippers</b> attend the mosque.</i>
<b>young lady</b>	English poet (1683-1765).
<b>young man</b>	United States film and television actress (1913-2000).

- *Very popular with (a specified set of people).*

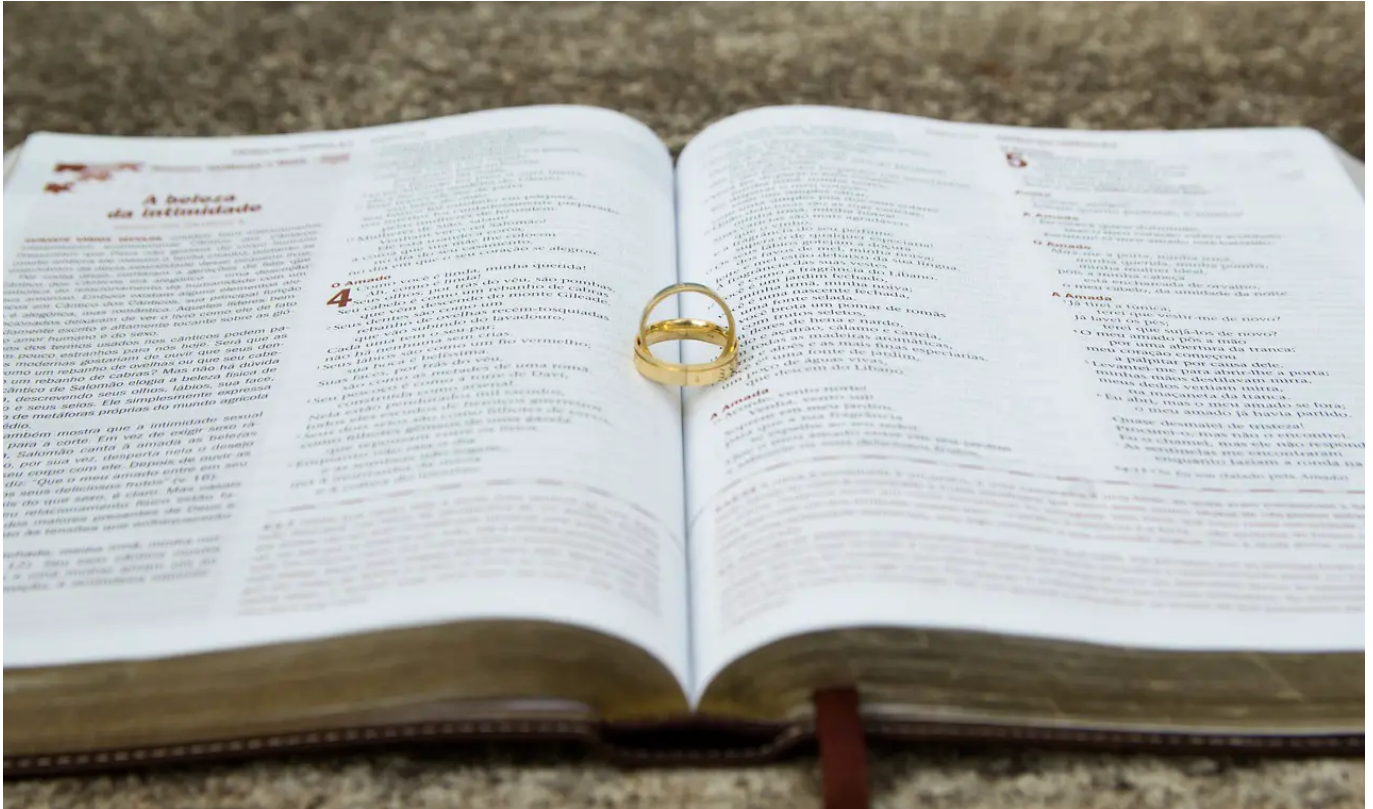




## Synonyms of "Beloved" as an adjective (19 Words)

<b>admired</b>	Regarded with admiration.
<b>adored</b>	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god). <i><b>Adored</b> grandchildren.</i>
<b>cherished</b>	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>A <b>cherished</b> friend.</i>
<b><u>darling</u></b>	Dearly loved. <i>His <b>darling</b> wife.</i>
<b><u>dear</u></b>	Endearing sweet. <i>One s <b>dearest</b> wish.</i>
<b>dearest</b>	Dearly loved. <i>One of my <b>dearest</b> friends.</i>

<b>esteemed</b>	Held in great respect; admired. <i>Our <b>esteemed</b> leader.</i>
<b>exalted</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>An <b>exalted</b> ideal.</i>
<b>favourite</b>	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>Their <b>favourite</b> Italian restaurant.</i>
<b>idolized</b>	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god). <i>An <b>idolized</b> wife.</i>
<b>liked</b>	Conforming in every respect. <i>A well <b>liked</b> teacher.</i>
<b>loved</b>	Held dear. <i>His <b>loved</b> companion of many years.</i>
<b>much loved</b>	Great in quantity or degree or extent.
<b>precious</b>	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>My time s <b>precious</b>.</i>
<b>prized</b>	Extremely highly valued. <i>The bicycle was her most <b>prized</b> possession.</i>
<b>revered</b>	Profoundly honored. <i><b>Revered</b> holy men.</i>
<b>treasured</b>	Highly valued; prized. <i>A <b>treasured</b> heirloom.</i>
<b>valued</b>	Held in great esteem for admirable qualities especially of an intrinsic nature. <i>Triple <b>valued</b>.</i>
<b>worshipped</b>	Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god).

- amity** A cordial disposition.  
*The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than **amity**.*
- attachment** A supplementary part or accessory.  
*The students are placed on **attachment** to schools for one day a week.*
- brethren** Fellow Christians or members of a male religious order.  
*Our **brethren** in the popular press.*

<b>conjugal</b>	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple. <i><b>Conjugal</b> visits.</i>
<b>connubial</b>	In a conjugal manner. <i><b>Connubial</b> bliss.</i>
<b>consummate</b>	Perfect and complete in every respect; having all necessary qualities. <i>The property sale is <b>consummated</b>.</i>
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition.
<b><u>darling</u></b>	(in affected use) pretty; charming. <i>A <b>darling</b> little pillbox hat.</i>
<b><u>dear</u></b>	A sweet or endearing person. <i>Five pounds that s a bit <b>dear</b>.</i>
<b>dearly</b>	In a sincere and heartfelt manner. <i>Freedom to worship our religion has been bought <b>dearly</b>.</i>
<b>enthusiast</b>	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car <b>enthusiast</b>.</i>
<b>favorite</b>	Something regarded with special favor or liking. <i>That book is one of my <b>favorites</b>.</i>
<b><u>fondly</u></b>	With affection or liking. <i>She spoke to her children <b>fondly</b>.</i>
<b><u>friendship</u></b>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>This is an ideal group for finding support and <b>friendship</b>.</i>
<b>heterosexual</b>	A heterosexual person. <i><b>Heterosexual</b> relationships.</i>
<b><u>husband</u></b>	Use (resources) economically. <i>She <b>husbanded</b> their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
<b>interest</b>	Excite the curiosity of engage the interest of. <i>In the common <b>interest</b>.</i>
<b>kiss</b>	Used to express affection at the end of a letter (conventionally represented by the letter X). <i>She <b>kissed</b> her grandfather on the forehead when she entered the room.</i>
<b>matrimony</b>	The state of being married; marriage. <i>The joys of <b>matrimony</b>.</i>
<b>moll</b>	The girlfriend of a gangster. <i>I d rush the money over to his <b>moll</b>.</i>
<b><u>paramour</u></b>	A lover, especially the illicit partner of a married person.
<b>philander</b>	Talk or behave amorously, without serious intentions. <i>Married men who <b>philander</b>.</i>

- platonic** (of love or friendship) intimate and affectionate but not sexual.  
*Platonic love.*
- popular** Liked or admired by many people or by a particular person or group.  
*A democratic or **popular** movement.*
- romance** The group of languages derived from Latin.  
*A holiday **romance**.*
- sisterhood** The relationship between sisters.  
*Much of **sisterhood** is about sharing lipsticks.*
- unrequited** (of a feeling, especially love) not returned.  
*He s been pining with **unrequited** love.*
