- *A long seat in Parliament for politicians of a specified party.*
- *The reserve players on a team.*
- *A long work table in a workshop or laboratory.*
- *A seat at the side of a sports field for coaches, substitutes, and players not taking part in a game.*
- *The office of judge or magistrate.*
- *A judge or magistrate presiding over a particular case.*
- *The seat for judges in a courtroom.*
- *A strong worktable for a carpenter or mechanic.*
- *A long seat for more than one person.*
- *A long seat for several people, typically made of wood or stone.*
- *A judge's seat in a law court.*
- *Persons who administer justice.*
- *The politicians occupying a specified bench in Parliament.*
- *The magistrate or judge or judges sitting in court in judicial capacity to compose the*

court collectively.

- *A level shelf of land interrupting a declivity (with steep slopes above and below.*
- *A flat ledge in masonry or on sloping ground.*
- *(law) the seat for judges in a courtroom.*

A flat portable surface usually rectangular designed for board games.
A **board** meeting.

buffet

A meal set out on a buffet at which guests help themselves.
A cold **buffet** lunch.

counter

Game equipment (as a piece of wood, plastic, or ivory) used for keeping a count or reserving a space in various card or board games.
The **counter** tells you how many pictures you have taken.

form

A set order of words a formula.
She seemed to be on good **form**.

judges	A book of the Old Testament that tells the history of Israel under the leaders known as judges.
judicature	The act of meting out justice according to the law. <i>The constitutional principle that the legislature is separate from the judicature.</i>
judiciary	Persons who administer justice. <i>The independence of the judiciary.</i>
magistrates	A lay judge or civil authority who administers the law (especially one who conducts a court dealing with minor offenses).
pew	A seat. <i>Take a pew What ll you have.</i>
seat	A thing made or used for sitting on, such as a chair or stool. <i>The brain is said to be the seat of reason.</i>
settle	A long wooden bench with a back.
stall	An instance of an engine vehicle aircraft or boat stalling. <i>Speed must be maintained to avoid a stall and loss of control.</i>
table	Multiplication tables. <i>He was reputed to have the finest French table of the time.</i>
terrace	A level paved area next to a building; a patio. <i>An attractive Regency terrace.</i>
trestle table	Sawhorses used in pairs to support a horizontal tabletop.
work bench	A manifestation of energy; the transfer of energy from one physical system to another expressed as the product of a force and the distance through which it moves a body in the direction of that force.
work surface	The occupation for which you are paid.
workbench	A flat table or surface at which carpentry or other mechanical or practical work is done.
worktable	A table at which one may work, especially one with drawers or compartments for holding tools or materials.

Act or preside as chair as of an academic department in a university.
*He was awarded an endowed **chair** in economics.*

<u>couch</u>	Lower (a spear) to the position for attack. <i>Cataracts when simple are to be couched.</i>
<u>cushion</u>	A mechanical damper; absorbs energy of sudden impulses. <i>To cushion the blow wages and pensions were increased.</i>
desk	A counter in a hotel, bank, or airport at which a customer may check in or obtain information. <i>The reception desk.</i>
desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the desktop.</i>
<u>dining</u>	The act of eating dinner. <i>A dining area.</i>
<u>down</u>	Shoot at and force to come down. <i>Prices plunged downward.</i>
<u>furniture</u>	The small accessories or fittings that are required for a particular task or function. <i>They had too much furniture for the small apartment.</i>
<u>gym</u>	Gymnastics. <i>I can't do gym today.</i>
idly	In an aimless or lazy way. <i>I can no longer stand idly by and let him take the blame.</i>
incubate	(in a laboratory or other controlled situation) keep (eggs, bacteria, embryos, etc.) at a suitable temperature so that they develop. <i>The samples were incubated at 80 C for 3 minutes.</i>
<u>kitchen</u>	A set of fittings and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i>A fully fitted kitchen at a bargain price.</i>
locate	Take up residence and become established. <i>Our sense of sight enables us to locate objects in space.</i>
nestle	Position comfortably. <i>The baby nestled her head in her mother's elbow.</i>
<u>park</u>	Maneuver a vehicle into a parking space. <i>Can you park right here.</i>
proscenium	The part of a theatre stage in front of the curtain.
recliner	A chair with a reclining back, especially one with an integral footrest.
seat	Be able to seat. <i>The mother seated the toddler on the high chair.</i>

- sit** Be or remain in a particular position or state.
*The fridge was **sitting** in a pool of water.*
- sofa** A long upholstered seat with a back and arms, for two or more people.
***Sofa** cushions.*
- stool** Lure with a stool as of wild fowl.
*Concentrations of the substance in normal **stool**.*
- table** A list of rivals or competitors showing their positions relative to one another a league table.
*She sets a fine **table**.*
- tensile** Relating to tension.
*A **tensile** force.*
- terrace** Provide a house with a terrace.
*Breakfast is served on the **terrace**.*
- workbench** A strong worktable for a carpenter or mechanic.
