Associations of "Bend over backwards" (30 Words)

absenteeism	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
banister	A railing at the side of a staircase or balcony to prevent people from falling. <i>He vaulted the banister.</i>
bending	The act of bending something.
bow	Play a stringed instrument or music using a bow. <i>The techniques by which the pieces were bowed.</i>
ductile	Easily influenced. <i>Ductile copper.</i>
exorbitant	(of a price or amount charged) unreasonably high. <i>Exorbitant rent.</i>
fold	Be able to be opened out unfold. <i>A more active period of igneous activity caused intense folding.</i>
gangling	(of a person) tall, thin, and awkward in movements or bearing. <i>A gangling teenager.</i>
inordinate	Beyond normal limits. <i>A book of inordinate length.</i>
intemperate	Having or showing a lack of self-control; immoderate. <i>Intemperate outbursts concerning global conspiracies.</i>
inverse	Reversed (turned backward) in order or nature or effect. <i>Inverse logarithms.</i>
lean	Cause to lean to the side. <i>A lean budget.</i>
oblique	An oblique muscle. <i>It is the obliques and abdominals which create the well trained look.</i>

outdo	Be superior to in action or performance. <i>The men tried to outdo each other in their generosity.</i>
<u>overcome</u>	Overcome as with emotions or perceptual stimuli. <i>She was obviously overcome with excitement.</i>
<u>plethora</u>	Extreme excess. <i>Allen won a plethora of medals during his illustrious career.</i>
prodigal	A person who leaves home to lead a prodigal life but later makes a repentant return. <i>The government wished to clip the wings of the local authority prodigals.</i>
pucker	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>She puckered her lips.</i>
recumbent	A type of bicycle designed to be ridden lying almost flat on one's back. <i>Recumbent shrubs.</i>
redundance	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
stoop	Carry oneself, often habitually, with head, shoulders, and upper back bent forward. <i>The old man was stooping but he could walk around without a cane.</i>
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
superfluous	Unnecessary, especially through being more than enough. <i>The purchaser should avoid asking for superfluous information.</i>
<u>surplus</u>	An excess of income or assets over expenditure or liabilities in a given period, typically a financial year. <i>Surplus cheese distributed to the needy.</i>
tiredness	The state of wishing for sleep or rest; weariness. <i>Tiredness overcame her and she fell into a deep slumber.</i>
<u>too</u>	Very. <i>You re too kind.</i>
<u>undue</u>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i>This figure did not give rise to undue concern.</i>
unnecessary	Unnecessary things. <i>Good construction is essential to avoid unnecessary waste.</i>
wizened	Shrivelled or wrinkled with age. <i>A wizened weather beaten old man.</i>
wrinkle	Grimace and cause wrinkles on a part of the face. <i>You just cannot look neat with wrinkled clothes.</i>
