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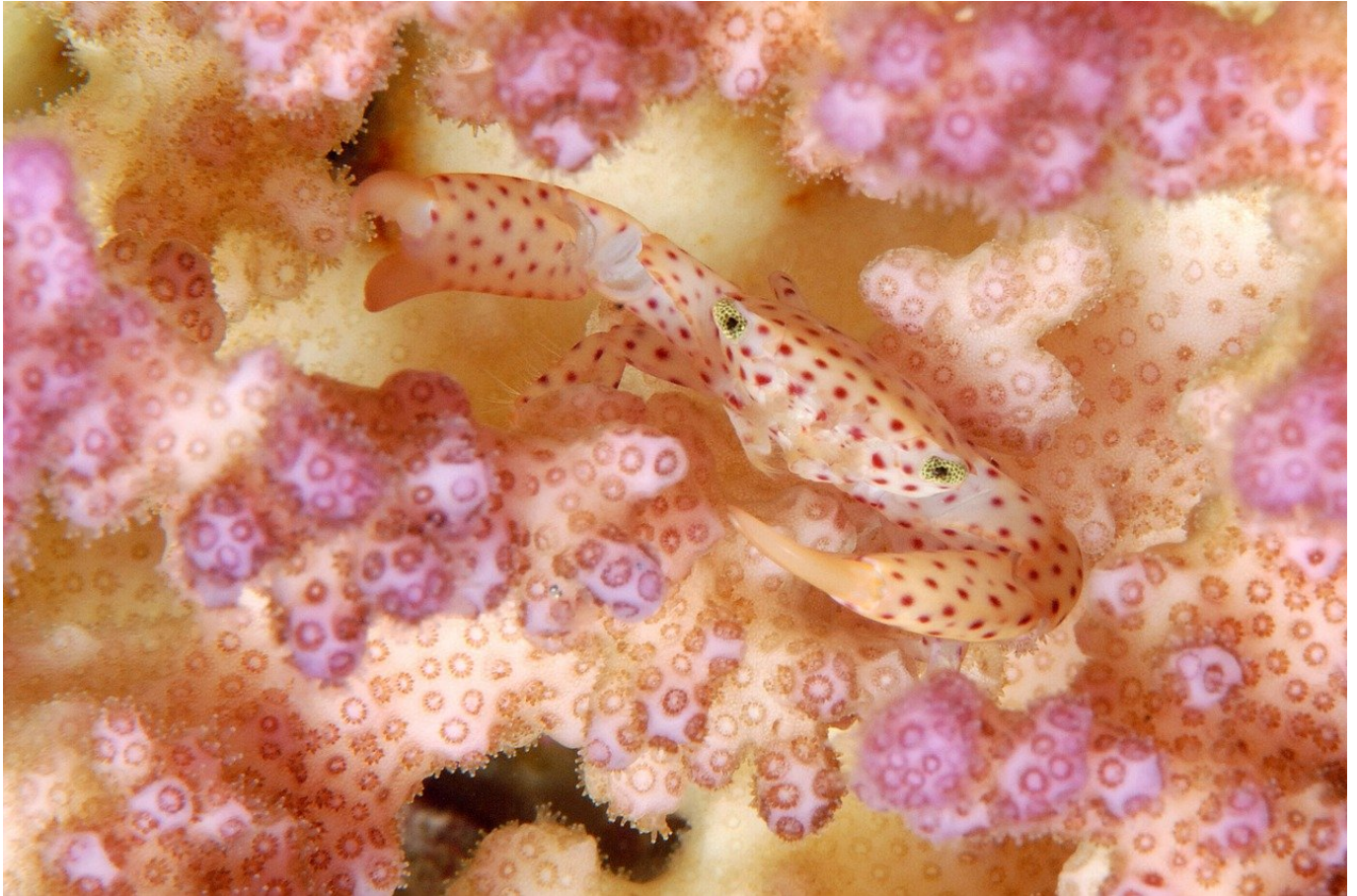

## **Beneath as an Adverb**

### **Definitions of "Beneath" as an adverb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “beneath” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Hidden behind an appearance.*
- *At a lower level or layer.*
- *In or to a place that is lower.*
- *Extending or directly underneath something.*



## Synonyms of "Beneath" as an adverb (7 Words)

- below** See below.  
*Our nutritionist is pictured **below** right.*
- down** Used as a command to a person or animal to sit or lie down.  
*He swung the axe to chop **down** the tree.*
- downward** Used to indicate that something applies to everyone in a certain hierarchy or set.  
*New rules on sick leave affect employees of all grades from managers **downwards**.*
- further down** To or at a greater distance in time or space (‘farther’ is used more frequently than ‘further’ in this physical sense).
- in a lower place** To or toward the inside of.
- lower** In or into a lower position.  
*The sun sank **lower**.*

**underneath**

Partly or wholly concealed by a garment.  
*There was plenty of storage room **underneath**.*



**Usage Examples of "Beneath" as an adverb**

- *The smile revealed the evil beneath.*
- *Upper layers can be removed to reveal internal parts beneath.*
- *A house built on stilts to allow air to circulate beneath.*





## Associations of "Beneath" (30 Words)

<b>behind</b>	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>Campbell grabbed him from <b>behind</b>.</i>
<b>below</b>	On a floor below. <i>See <b>below</b>.</i>
<b>bottom</b>	Situated at the bottom or lowest position. <i>River <b>bottoms</b>.</i>
<b>burial</b>	The action or practice of burying a dead body. <i>They will give him a proper <b>burial</b>.</i>
<b>bury</b>	Dismiss from the mind; stop remembering. <i>He ran through to <b>bury</b> a right foot shot inside the near post.</i>
<b>casket</b>	Enclose in a casket. <i>A small brass <b>casket</b> containing four black opals.</i>
<b>cemetery</b>	A tract of land used for burials. <i>A military <b>cemetery</b>.</i>
<b>coffin</b>	Put a dead body in a coffin. <i>Her body was <b>coffined</b>.</i>
<b>crypt</b>	A small tubular gland, pit, or recess.

<b>culvert</b>	Channel a stream or drain through a culvert. <i>A <b>culverted</b> drain.</i>
<b>entomb</b>	Place in a grave or tomb. <i>Mummified bodies were <b>entombed</b> in the pyramids of Egypt.</i>
<b>inhume</b>	Bury. <i>No hand his bones shall gather or <b>inhume</b>.</i>
<b>inter</b>	Place in a grave or tomb. <i>He was <b>interred</b> with the military honours due to him.</i>
<b>interment</b>	The ritual placing of a corpse in a grave. <i><b>Interments</b> took place in the churchyard.</i>
<b>low</b>	Of a vowel pronounced with the tongue held low in the mouth open. <i>Brought <b>low</b>.</i>
<b>mausoleum</b>	A large burial chamber, usually above ground. <i>A cultural <b>mausoleum</b> such as the Tate.</i>
<b>mummification</b>	A condition resembling that of a mummy. <i>Bureaucratic <b>mummification</b> in red tape.</i>
<b>necropolis</b>	A tract of land used for burials.
<b>nether</b>	Dwelling beneath the surface of the earth. <i>The ballast is suspended from its <b>nether</b> end.</i>
<b>quietus</b>	Something that has a calming or soothing effect.
<b>sarcophagus</b>	A stone coffin, typically adorned with a sculpture or inscription and associated with the ancient civilizations of Egypt, Rome, and Greece.
<b>sepulcher</b>	A chamber that is used as a grave.
<b>submergence</b>	Sinking until covered completely with water. <i>Total <b>submergence</b> of plants results in heavy crop losses.</i>
<b>subnormal</b>	A person of less than normal intelligence. <i>When you lose enough body heat to make your temperature <b>subnormal</b> you become hypothermic.</i>
<b>subterranean</b>	Secret; concealed. <i><b>Subterranean</b> motives for murder.</i>
<b>tomb</b>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>None escape the <b>tomb</b>.</i>
<b>under</b>	Under water. <i>Weaving the body through the crossbars over and <b>under</b> over and <b>under</b>.</i>
<b>underground</b>	An underground railway especially the one in London. <i><b>Underground</b> resistance.</i>

**underneath**

So as to be concealed by something else.

*He was wearing a brown jacket with a white T shirt **underneath**.*

**underpass**

An underground tunnel or passage enabling pedestrians to cross a road or railway.
