Associations of "Beneficiaries" (30 Words)

benefactor	A person who helps people or institutions (especially with financial help). <i>A low interest loan from a benefactor allowed them to build a floor for the exhibition hall.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>Bestow an honor on someone.</i>
charitable	(of an organization or activity) officially recognized as devoted to the assistance of those in need. <i>Charitable to the poor.</i>
charity	Kindness and tolerance in judging others. <i>Faith hope and charity.</i>
contribute	Contribute to some cause. <i>The government imposed a tax on fuels which contributed to global warming.</i>
contribution	A voluntary gift (as of money or service or ideas) made to some worthwhile cause. <i>Local historians are requesting contributions for a forthcoming book on the history of the community.</i>
disinherit	Prevent deliberately (as by making a will) from inheriting. <i>The Duke is seeking to disinherit his eldest son.</i>
donate	Allow the removal of (blood or an organ) from one’s body for transplantation, transfusion, or research. <i>Donate money to the orphanage.</i>
<u>donation</u>	Something that is given to a charity, especially a sum of money. <i>The donation of carpets chairs and cutlery.</i>
donee	A person who receives a gift.
donor	Person who makes a gift of property. <i>One third of patients die before a suitable donor is found.</i>

endowment	A quality or ability possessed or inherited by someone. <i>He tried to promote the endowment of a Chair of Psychiatry.</i>
fiduciary	Relating to or of the nature of a legal trust (i.e. the holding of something in trust for another. <i>The company has a fiduciary duty to shareholders.</i>
fundraiser	A person whose job or task is to seek financial support for a charity, cause, or other enterprise. <i>A fundraiser for the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Society.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>It s getting so I can t even think.</i>
gift	Give as a present make a gift of. <i>His mother s gift of a pen.</i>
give	Give as medicine. <i>The heavy door didn t give until the fifth push.</i>
giver	Someone who devotes himself completely. <i>A giver of advice.</i>
grantor	A person who makes a grant in legal form. <i>Conveyed from grantor to grantee.</i>
gratuity	A sum of money paid to an employee at the end of a period of employment. <i>An end of contract gratuity of 20 of the total pay received.</i>
humanitarian	Of or relating to or characteristic of humanitarianism. <i>Groups sending humanitarian aid.</i>
largess	Liberality in bestowing gifts; extremely liberal and generous of spirit.
potlatch	Hold a potlatch.
priceless	Very amusing. <i>Darling you re priceless.</i>
receive	Receive a specified treatment abstract. <i>She received only cuts and bruises.</i>
recipient	A person or thing that receives or is awarded something. <i>A recipient country.</i>
selfless	Showing unselfish concern for the welfare of others. <i>An act of selfless devotion.</i>
thank	Express gratitude or show appreciation to. <i>You have only yourself to thank for the plight you are in.</i>
voucher	A receipt.
wrapper	A loose robe or gown. <i>She put a wrapper over her nightdress.</i>
