- *Not dangerous to health; not recurrent or progressive (especially of a tumor).*
- *Gentle and kindly.*
- *(of a disease) not harmful in effect.*
- *Kindness of disposition or manner.*
- *(of a tumour) not malignant.*

<b>beneficial</b>	Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous. <i>The <b>beneficial</b> effect on the economy.</i>
<b>benevolent</b>	Showing or motivated by sympathy and understanding and generosity. <i>A <b>benevolent</b> smile.</i>
<b>benignant</b>	Characterized by kindness and warm courtesy especially of a king to his subjects. <i>An old man with a <b>benignant</b> expression.</i>
<b>calm</b>	Free from storm or wind. <i>A dead <b>calm</b> sea.</i>
<b>caring</b>	Feeling and exhibiting concern and empathy for others. <i>A <b>caring</b> and invaluable friend.</i>
<b>clement</b>	(of a person or their actions) merciful. <i><b>Clement</b> weather.</i>
<b>compassionate</b>	Showing or having compassion. <i>I allowed him to go home on <b>compassionate</b> grounds.</i>
<a href="#"><u>congenial</u></a>	(used of plants) capable of cross-fertilization or of being grafted. <i>A <b>congenial</b> atmosphere to work in.</i>
<a href="#"><u>considerate</u></a>	Showing careful thought. <i>Be <b>considerate</b> over your handwriting.</i>

<b>cordial</b>	Warm and friendly. A <b>cordial</b> greeting.
<b>favourable</b>	Suggesting a good outcome. A very <b>favourable</b> sometimes glorious October.
<b>friendly</b>	(of troops or equipment) of, belonging to, or allied with one's own forces. A consumer <b>friendly</b> policy.
<b>generous</b>	(of a thing) larger or more plentiful than is usual or necessary. A <b>generous</b> helping of pasta.
<b>genial</b>	Friendly and cheerful. The <b>genial</b> sunshine.
<b>gentle</b>	Easily handled or managed. A <b>gentle</b> nocturne.
<b>good-humoured</b>	Disposed to please- Hal Hinson.
<b>good-natured</b>	Having an easygoing and cheerful disposition.
<b>gracious</b>	Courteous, kind, and pleasant, especially towards someone of lower social status. A <b>gracious</b> hostess.
<b>harmless</b>	Not able or likely to cause harm. As an entertainer he s pretty <b>harmless</b> .
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <b>Helpful</b> staff.
<b>indulgent</b>	Self indulgent. An <b>indulgent</b> attitude.
<b>innocent</b>	Lacking in sophistication or worldliness. She is a poor <b>innocent</b> young creature.
<b>kind</b>	Agreeable, conducive to comfort. A dry climate <b>kind</b> to asthmatics.
<b>kindly</b>	Pleasant and agreeable. A <b>kindly</b> climate.
<b>liberal</b>	Willing to respect or accept behaviour or opinions different from one's own; open to new ideas. The provision of <b>liberal</b> adult education.
<b>mild</b>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. A <b>mild</b> Italian cheese.
<b>obliging</b>	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. The <b>obliging</b> waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.

<b><u>pleasant</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) friendly and considerate; likeable. <i>We had a <b>pleasant</b> evening together.</i>
<b><u>refreshing</u></b>	Imparting vitality and energy. <i>Common sense of a most <b>refreshing</b> sort.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Soft and mild not harsh or stern or severe. <i>He was <b>soft</b> on his children.</i>
<b><u>soothing</u></b>	Reducing pain or discomfort. <i>A <b>soothing</b> ointment for her sunburn.</i>
<b><u>sympathetic</u></b>	Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i><b>Sympathetic</b> neurons.</i>
<b>temperate</b>	Not extreme in behavior. <i><b>Temperate</b> plants.</i>
<b><u>tender</u></b>	Given to sympathy or gentleness or sentimentality. <i>Pelargoniums are colourful but <b>tender</b> plants.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>He was attentive and <b>thoughtful</b>.</i>
<b><u>unselfish</u></b>	Disregarding your own advantages and welfare over those of others. <i><b>Unselfish</b> devotion.</i>
