anguished Experiencing or expressing severe mental or physical pain or suffering.

bitterly To an extreme, forceful, or particularly harsh degree.

A **bitterly** cold day.

deplore Express strong disapproval of.

We **deplore** all violence.

despondent In low spirits from loss of hope or courage.

Despondent about his failure.

Failing to fulfil someone's hopes or expectations.

disappointing It was disappointing that there were relatively few possibilities.

(of events) having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing

disastrous ruin.

United made a **disastrous** start to the season.

doleful Expressing sorrow; mournful.

The child's **doleful** expression.

dolorous Feeling or expressing great sorrow or distress.

A **dolorous** and repetitive tale of atrocity.

elegiac Verses in an elegiac metre.

An **elegiac** lament for youthful ideals.

elegy A mournful poem; a lament for the dead.

frustrated Disappointingly unsuccessful.

Jealousies and **frustrated** passions.



Causing annoyance or upset because of an inability to change or achieve

frustrating something.

It can be very **frustrating** to find that the size you want isn t there.

Feel grief.

grieve It grieves me to think of you in that house alone.

Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm.

grievous A grievous crime.

heartrending Causing or marked by grief or anguish.

The **heartrending** words of Rabin s granddaughter.

heartsick Full of sorrow.

Too **heartsick** to fight back.

lamentable (of circumstances or conditions) very bad; deplorable.

A lamentable decision.

The amount by which the cost of a business exceeds its revenue.

He will be a great **loss** to many people.

lugubrious Looking or sounding sad and dismal.

His face looked even more **lugubrious** than usual.

mournful Expressing sorrow.

Mournful music.

mourningBlack clothes worn as an expression of sorrow when someone dies.

She s still in **mourning** after the death of her husband.

Arousing pity, especially through vulnerability or sadness.

It was a **pathetic** sight.

pitiful Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy.

A **pitiful** fate.

plaintive Sounding sad and mournful.

A plaintive cry.

regrettable Deserving regret.

It s regrettable that she didn t go to college.

ruth A feeling of sympathy and sorrow for the misfortunes of others.

Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti.

sad She doesn t like sad movies.

Causing grief.

sorrowful Causing grief.

Even in laughter the heart is **sorrowful**.

tragic Causing or characterized by extreme distress or sorrow.

A **tragic** accident.



unhappy Not ha

Not happy.
