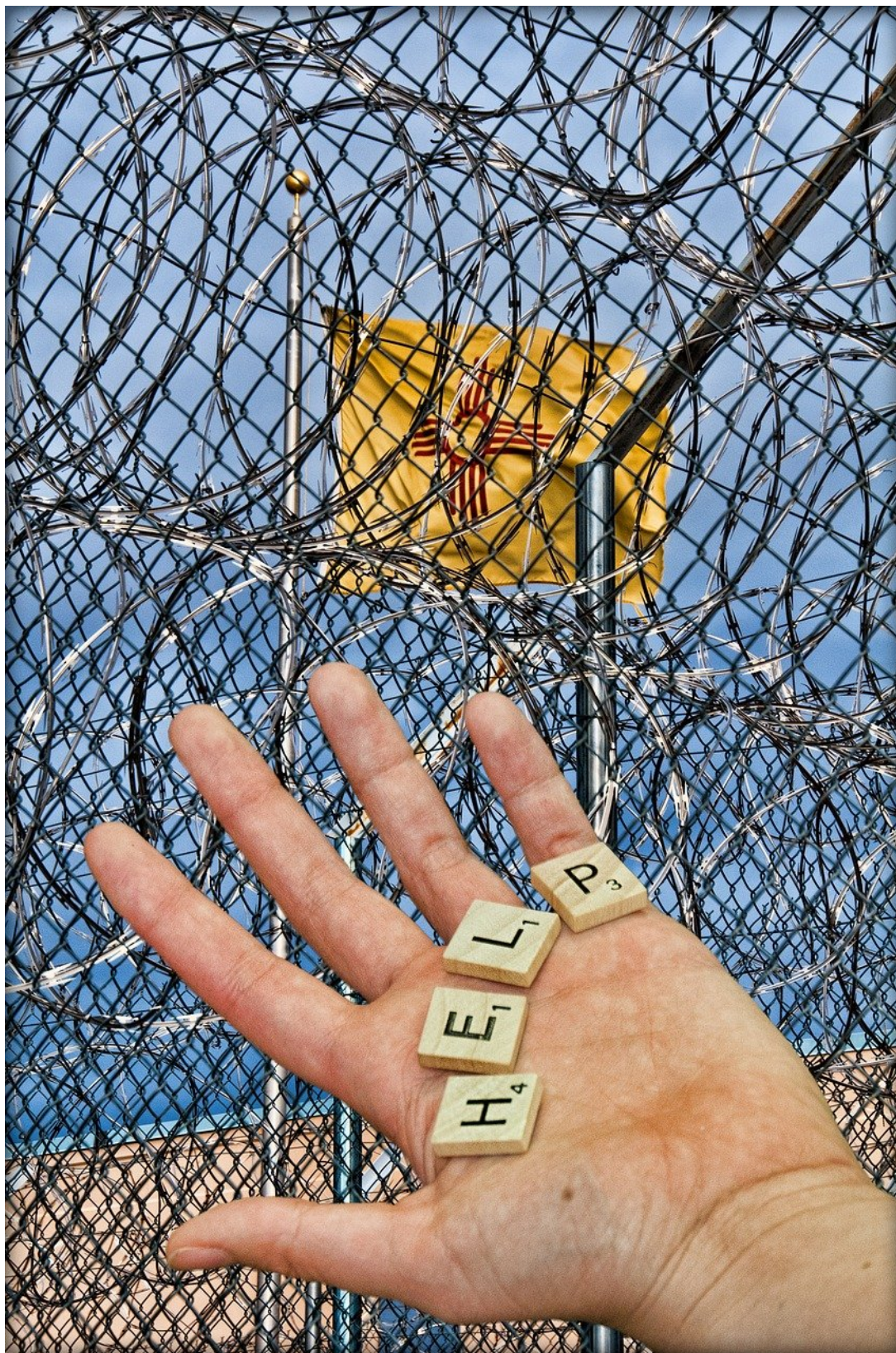
## Beseech as a Verb

### Definitions of "Beseech" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “beseech” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat.*
- *Ask for or request earnestly.*







## Synonyms of "Beseech" as a verb (16 Words)

<b>adjure</b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>I <b>adjure</b> you to tell me the truth.</i>
<b>appeal to</b>	Be attractive to.
<b>ask urgently</b>	Require or ask for as a price or condition.
<b><u>beg</u></b>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>A piece of bread which I <b>begged</b> from a farmer.</i>
<b>bid</b>	Make a statement during the auction undertaking to make a certain number of tricks with a stated suit as trumps if the bid is successful and one becomes the declarer. <i>Nineteen companies have indicated their intention to <b>bid</b> for the contract.</i>
<b>call on</b>	Lure by imitating the characteristic call of an animal.
<b><u>conjure</u></b>	Implore (someone) to do something. <i>A special tune that <b>conjures</b> up a particular time and place.</i>
<b><u>entreat</u></b>	Ask earnestly or anxiously for (something). <i>A message had been sent <b>entreating</b> aid for the Navahos.</i>
<b><u>exhort</u></b>	Spur on or encourage especially by cheers and shouts. <i>Come on you guys <b>exhorted</b> Linda.</i>
<b>implore</b>	Beg someone earnestly or desperately to do something. <i>He <b>implored</b> her to change her mind.</i>
<b>importune</b>	Beg persistently and urgently. <i>The president would <b>importune</b> them to try harder.</i>
<b><u>petition</u></b>	Write a petition for something to somebody request formally and in writing. <i>The custodial parent <b>petitioned</b> the court for payment of the arrears.</i>
<b>plead with</b>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding, especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts.
<b>pray to</b>	Address a deity, a prophet, a saint or an object of worship; say a prayer.
<b>press</b>	Create by pressing. <i><b>Pressed</b> flowers.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly. <i>The plutocracy <b>supplicated</b> to be made peers.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Beseech" as a verb

- *They beseeched him to stay.*

- 'You have got to believe me,' Violet beseeched him.
- They earnestly beseeched his forgiveness.

<b>adjure</b>	Command solemnly. <i>I <b>adjure</b> you to tell me the truth.</i>
<b>appeal</b>	A serious, urgent, or heartfelt request. <i>He was found guilty but <b>appealed</b> immediately.</i>
<b>asking</b>	The verbal act of requesting.
<b>beg</b>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>I <b>beg</b> you to stop.</i>
<b>cadge</b>	Ask for and get free; be a parasite. <i>He <b>cadged</b> fivers off old school friends.</i>
<b>conjure</b>	Call (an image) to the mind. <i>They hoped to <b>conjure</b> up the spirit of their dead friend.</i>
<b>desperately</b>	In intense despair. <i>The soil <b>desperately</b> needed potash.</i>
<b>entreat</b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>The King I fear hath ill <b>entreated</b> her.</i>
<b>entreaty</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.</i>
<b>exhortation</b>	A communication intended to urge or persuade the recipients to take some action. <i><b>Exhortations</b> to consumers to switch off electrical appliances.</i>
<b>implore</b>	Beg earnestly for. <i>I <b>implore</b> mercy.</i>
<b>invitation</b>	A tempting allurement. <i>A wedding <b>invitation</b>.</i>
<b>invite</b>	Invite someone to one's house. <i>His use of the word did little but <b>invite</b> criticism.</i>
<b>lamentation</b>	The passionate expression of grief or sorrow; weeping. <i>Scenes of <b>lamentation</b>.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	Needed to be done, achieved, or present; essential. <i>It is not <b>necessary</b> for you to be here.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	The state or fact of being required. <i>The <b>necessity</b> of providing parental guidance.</i>

<b>paging</b>	The system of numbering pages. <i>The public address system in the hospital was used for <b>paging</b>.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>petition</u></b>	Present a petition to an authority in respect of a particular cause. <i>A steady stream of <b>petitions</b> to Allah were audible.</i>
<b><u>plea</u></b>	(law) a defendant's answer by a factual matter (as distinguished from a demurrer). <i>Her <b>plea</b> of a headache was not entirely false.</i>
<b><u>plead</u></b>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>The youth <b>pleaded</b> guilty to murdering the girl.</i>
<b><u>pray</u></b>	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>Ladies and gentlemen <b>pray</b> be seated.</i>
<b><u>prayer</u></b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>The priest sank to his knees in <b>prayer</b>.</i>
<b>request</b>	The verbal act of requesting. <i>She <b>requested</b> an extra bed in her room.</i>
<b><u>solicit</u></b>	Make a solicitation or petition for something desired. <i>He called a meeting to <b>solicit</b> their views.</i>
<b><u>solicitation</u></b>	The act of enticing a person to do something wrong (as an offer of sex in return for money). <i>He was a regular target for <b>solicitation</b> of funds.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	Humbly entreating. <i>Their faces were wary and <b>suppliant</b>.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i><b>Suplicants</b> prostrate themselves on the floor.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Make a humble, earnest petition. <i>The plutocracy <b>supplicated</b> to be made peers.</i>
<b>woo</b>	Seek the favour, support, or custom of. <i>Pop stars are being <b>wooed</b> by film companies eager to sign them up.</i>
