<b>befuddled</b>	Unable to think clearly; confused or perplexed. <i>The wino s poor <b>befuddled</b> mind.</i>
<b>blind drunk</b>	Unable or unwilling to perceive or understand.
<b>blotto</b>	Extremely drunk. <i>We got <b>blotto</b>.</i>
<b>captivated by</b>	Strongly attracted.

<b>charmed by</b>	Filled with wonder and delight.
<b>cockeyed</b>	Turned or twisted toward one side. <i>That s a <b>cockeyed</b> idea.</i>
<b>crooked</b>	Very drunk. <i>He replaced the <b>crooked</b> captain early in the game.</i>
<b>devoted to</b>	Dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use.
<b>doting on</b>	Extravagantly or foolishly loving and indulgent.
<b>drunken</b>	Given to or marked by the consumption of alcohol. <i>The man s <b>drunken</b> slurred speech.</i>
<b>fuddled</b>	Confused or stupefied, especially as a result of drinking alcohol. <i>Benjamin was trying to clear his drink <b>fuddled</b> brain.</i>
<b>hopelessly in love with</b>	Beyond hope of management or reform.
<b>in love with</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b><u>incapable</u></b>	Not having the temperament or inclination for. <i>With the battery removed the car was <b>incapable</b> of being driven.</i>
<b><u>inebriated</u></b>	Drunk; intoxicated. <i>I got mildly <b>inebriated</b>.</i>
<b>infatuated with</b>	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness.
<b><u>intoxicated</u></b>	Drunk or under the influence of drugs. <i>Felt <b>intoxicated</b> by her success.</i>
<b>loaded</b>	Charged with ammunition. <i>She doesn t really have to work they re <b>loaded</b>.</i>
<b>maudlin</b>	(of a book, film, or song) highly sentimental. <i>A <b>maudlin</b> jukebox tune.</i>
<b>passionate about</b>	Having or expressing strong emotions.
<b>pie-eyed</b>	Very drunk.
<b>pixilated</b>	Very drunk.
<b>plastered</b>	(of hair) made smooth by applying a sticky or glossy substance. <i>I went out and got totally <b>plastered</b>.</i>
<b>slopped</b>	Very drunk.
<b>sloshed</b>	Very drunk. <i>I drank a lot of wine and got <b>sloshed</b>.</i>
<b><u>smashed</u></b>	Violently or badly broken or shattered. <i>When they go back to the barracks the single men get <b>smashed</b>.</i>
<b>smitten with</b>	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness.

<b><u>soaked</u></b>	Very drunk. <i>Rain <b>soaked</b> streets.</i>
<b>sozzled</b>	Very drunk. <i>A permanently <b>sozzled</b> woman.</i>
<b>squiffy</b>	Slightly drunk. <i>The graphics make your eyes go <b>squiffy</b>.</i>
<b><u>stiff</u></b>	Not moving as freely as is usual or desirable; difficult to turn or operate. <i>A <b>stiff</b> black collar.</i>
<b>the worse for drink</b>	Changed for the worse in health or fitness.
<b>tight</b>	Of a community or other group of people having close relations tight knit. <i><b>Tight</b> security.</i>
<b><u>tipsy</u></b>	Slightly intoxicated. <i>A <b>tipsy</b> boat.</i>
<b>under someone's spell</b>	Lower in rank, power, or authority.
<b>under the influence</b>	Lower in rank, power, or authority.
<b>very attracted to</b>	Being the exact same one; not any other.
<b>very taken with</b>	Precisely as stated.
<b><u>wet</u></b>	(of paint, ink, plaster, or a similar substance) not yet having dried or hardened. <i>A <b>wet</b> bathing suit.</i>
