The abandonment or renunciation of a religious or political belief or

principle. apostasy

The execution of their leader for **apostasy** brought widespread criticism.

apostate An apostate Roman Catholic.

An act of deliberate betrayal. **betraval**

One who reveals confidential information in return for money. betrayer

The desertion of one's country or cause in favour of an opposing one. defection

His **defection** from the Labour Party.

A person who abandons their duty (as on a military post. defector Staff interviewed escapees and **defector**s to the West.

Deserting your allegiance or duty to leader or cause or principle. <u>disloyal</u>

Disloyal mutterings about his leadership.

Acting in bad faith; deception by pretending to entertain one set of intentions

while acting under the influence of another. **duplicity**

The president was accused of **duplicity** in his dealings with Congress.

Without religious faith.

faithless They were ungodly and **faithless**.

fraudulence The quality of being fraudulent.



humbug Trick or deceive.

Poor Dave is easily **humbug**ged.

infidelity Disbelief in a particular religion, especially Christianity.

Her **infidelity** continued after her marriage.

perfidious Deceitful and untrustworthy.

The **perfidious** Judas.

perfidyThe state of being deceitful and untrustworthy.

Hapsburg **perfidy**.

Convert or attempt to convert (someone) from one religion, belief, or opinion

proselytize to another.

Davis wanted to share his concept and **proselytize** his ideas.

quisling A traitor who collaborates with an enemy force occupying their country.

He had the **Quisling** owner of the factory arrested.

Take part in a rebellion renounce a former allegiance.

Tory **rebel**s.

Become a renegade.

renegade Renegades and Deserters of Heaven who renounce their God for the Favour

of Man.

traitor Someone who betrays his country by committing treason.

He was a **traitor** to his own class.

traitorousRelating to or characteristic of a traitor; treacherous.

When his **traitorous** actions were discovered he was imprisoned.

Tending to betray especially having a treacherous character as attributed to

treacherous the Carthaginians by the Romans.

Memory is particularly **treacherous**.

Betrayal of trust.

treachery
The treachery of language.

An act of deliberate betraval.

Doubt is the ultimate **treason** against faith.

treasonable (of an offence or offender) punishable as treason or as committing treason.

There was no evidence of **treasonable** activity.

trick Deceive somebody.

He did conjuring **trick**s for his daughters.

A disloyal person who betrays or deserts his cause or religion or political

turncoat party or friend etc.

They denounced him as a **turncoat**.
