bespoken Pledged to be married.

Associations of "Betrothed" (30 Words)

- assurance** A statement intended to inspire confidence.
*She drove with **assurance**.*
- avow** Assert or confess openly.
*He **avowed** that he had voted Labour in every election.*
- avowal** A statement asserting the existence or the truth of something.
- betrothal** Formal engagement to be married; engagement.

celibacy	An unmarried status. <i>A priest who had taken a vow of celibacy.</i>
<u>commitment</u>	The trait of sincere and steadfast fixity of purpose. <i>The company's commitment to quality.</i>
consecrate	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. <i>Consecrate your life to the church.</i>
engagement	Contact by fitting together. <i>A good long engagement to give you time to be sure.</i>
ex	The 24th letter of the Roman alphabet. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
fealty	A feudal tenant's or vassal's sworn loyalty to a lord. <i>They owed fealty to the Earl rather than the King.</i>
fiance	A man who is engaged to be married.
fiancee	A woman who is engaged to be married.
fidelity	The degree of exactness with which something is copied or reproduced. <i>The 1949 recording provides reasonable fidelity.</i>
<u>girlfriend</u>	A person's regular female companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship. <i>Mary and her girlfriend organized the party.</i>
<u>lover</u>	A significant other to whom you are not related by marriage. <i>Music lovers.</i>
<u>manifesto</u>	A public declaration of intentions (as issued by a political party or government). <i>He may fudge key issues in the Labour manifesto.</i>
marriage	A close and intimate union. <i>A marriage of ideas.</i>
oath	A commitment to tell the truth especially in a court of law to lie under oath is to become subject to prosecution for perjury. <i>They took an oath of allegiance.</i>
<u>pact</u>	A written agreement between two states or sovereigns. <i>The country negotiated a trade pact with the US.</i>
<u>pledge</u>	Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>Signed a pledge never to reveal the secret.</i>
profess	Teach a subject as a professor. <i>He professed himself amazed at the boy's ability.</i>
promise	Make a promise or commitment. <i>I promise you my best effort.</i>

renege	Go back on a promise, undertaking, or contract. <i>There s one of them anyhow that didn t renege him.</i>
salutation	A standard formula of words used in a letter to address the person being written to. <i>He raised his glass in salutation.</i>
salute	Make a formal salute to. <i>When the officers show up the soldiers have to salute.</i>
troth	A solemn pledge of fidelity. <i>A token of troth.</i>
vow	Make a vow promise. <i>He vowed never to drink alcohol again.</i>
wed	Take in marriage. <i>Will you wed your daughter to him.</i>
wedding	A party of people at a wedding.
wife	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>He and his wife are keen gardeners.</i>
