| excellent | Extremely good; outstanding. <i>Their results are excellent.</i> |
| ideally | In the best possible way; perfectly. <i>Ideally you should exercise for 30 minutes every day.</i> |
| improve | Develop or increase in mental capacity by education or experience. <i>The weather improved toward evening.</i> |
| improving | Getting higher or more vigorous. <i>An improving economy.</i> |

| incomparable | Without an equal in quality or extent; matchless. <i>An incomparable week of rest and pleasure.</i> |
| increase | A change resulting in an increase. <i>Some increase in inflation is expected.</i> |
| meliorate | Get better. |
| noticeably | In a way that is easily seen or noticed; clearly. <i>After surgery she deteriorated noticeably.</i> |
| <u>optimize</u> | Make the best or most effective use of (a situation or resource). <i>We manage our time so that we optimize our productivity.</i> |
| outstanding | Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>Much of the work is still outstanding.</i> |
| reelect | Elect again. |
| <u>refinement</u> | Cultured elegance in behaviour or manner. <i>Recent refinements to production techniques.</i> |
| sere | Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with sere vegetation.</i> |
| significantly | In a way that has a particular meaning. <i>He paused significantly.</i> |
| splendid | Magnificent; very impressive. <i>The splendid coronation ceremony.</i> |
| superb | Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g superb lyrebird. <i>The Bey of Tunis was building himself a superb mausoleum.</i> |
| superior | Of high or superior quality or performance. <i>Trust magnates who felt themselves superior to law.</i> |
| superlative | The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of superlatives to describe him.</i> |
| <u>unsurpassed</u> | Not capable of being improved on. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i> |
| <u>upgrade</u> | The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>A room upgrade from a twin to a duplex suite.</i> |
| vantage | Place or situation affording some advantage especially a comprehensive view or commanding perspective. <i>From my vantage point I could see into the front garden.</i> |
