cocktail A dish consisting of small pieces of food, typically served cold as a starter.

A cocktail of drugs with severe side effects.

coffee A beverage consisting of an infusion of ground coffee beans.

A cup of **coffee**.

A brown carbonated drink that is flavoured with an extract of cola nuts or with

cola a similar flavouring. *A warm can of cola.*

drink Any liquid suitable for drinking. Let s **drink** to the New Year.

drinking The act of drinking alcoholic beverages to excess. He was ordered to cut down his **drinking**.

A substance suitable for consumption as food.

The people depend on sago starch as a basic foodstuff.



Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin.

Gin game.

gulp An act of gulping food or drink.

She finished her drink in one gulp.

guzzle Eat or drink (something) greedily.

This car **guzzle**s petrol.

honey Of something having the color of honey.

Her **honey** skin.

imbibe Drink (alcohol.

If one does not **imbibe** the culture one cannot succeed.

iuice Extract the juice from fruit or vegetables.

The batteries have run out of **juice**.

kava The shrub from which the kava root is obtained grown in the Pacific Islands.

lemon A distinctive tart flavor characteristic of lemons.

Garnish with a slice of **lemon**.

A drink made from lemon juice and water sweetened with sugar.

lemonade A jug of **lemonade**.

A chocolate with a liqueur filling.

An Italian almond flavoured **liqueur**.

mead An alcoholic drink of fermented honey and water.

The tavern stocks beer cider perry and **mead**.

nip A small sharp bite or snip.

The vegetable garden **nip**ped now by frost.

Heat popcorn or another foodstuff until it bursts open.

The farm popped into view as we turned the corner.

Suitable for drinking.

potableThere is no supply of **potable** water available.

To swallow hurriedly or greedily or in one draught.

Porter is a dark malty **quaff**.

Savor Give taste to. **Savor** the soup.

Drink in sips.
She was **sip**ping her tea.

A sodium salt of carbonic acid; used in making soap powders and glass and

soda paper.

A can of **soda**.
