Beverage as a Noun

Definitions of "Beverage" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “beverage” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Any liquid suitable for drinking.*
- *(chiefly in commercial use) a drink other than water.*



Synonyms of "Beverage" as a noun (3 Words)

drink The act of drinking alcoholic beverages to excess.
*A table covered with food and **drink**.*

drinkable Any liquid suitable for drinking.

potable Any liquid suitable for drinking.



Usage Examples of "Beverage" as a noun

Associations of "Beverage" (30 Words)

- cocktail** A dish consisting of small pieces of food, typically served cold as a starter.
*A **cocktail** of drugs with severe side effects.*
- coffee** A beverage consisting of an infusion of ground coffee beans.
*A cup of **coffee**.*
- cola** A brown carbonated drink that is flavoured with an extract of cola nuts or with a similar flavouring.
*A warm can of **cola**.*
- drink** Any liquid suitable for drinking.
*Let s **drink** to the New Year.*
- drinking** The act of drinking alcoholic beverages to excess.
*He was ordered to cut down his **drinking**.*
- foodstuff** A substance suitable for consumption as food.
*The people depend on sago starch as a basic **foodstuff**.*

gin	Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin. <i>Gin game.</i>
gulp	An act of gulping food or drink. <i>She finished her drink in one gulp.</i>
guzzle	Eat or drink (something) greedily. <i>This car guzzles petrol.</i>
honey	Of something having the color of honey. <i>Her honey skin.</i>
imbibe	Drink (alcohol). <i>If one does not imbibe the culture one cannot succeed.</i>
juice	Extract the juice from fruit or vegetables. <i>The batteries have run out of juice.</i>
kava	The shrub from which the kava root is obtained grown in the Pacific Islands.
lemon	A distinctive tart flavor characteristic of lemons. <i>Garnish with a slice of lemon.</i>
lemonade	A drink made from lemon juice and water sweetened with sugar. <i>A jug of lemonade.</i>
liqueur	A chocolate with a liqueur filling. <i>An Italian almond flavoured liqueur.</i>
mead	An alcoholic drink of fermented honey and water. <i>The tavern stocks beer cider perry and mead.</i>
nip	A small sharp bite or snip. <i>The vegetable garden nipped now by frost.</i>
pop	Heat popcorn or another foodstuff until it bursts open. <i>The farm popped into view as we turned the corner.</i>
potable	Suitable for drinking. <i>There is no supply of potable water available.</i>
quaff	To swallow hurriedly or greedily or in one draught. <i>Porter is a dark malty quaff.</i>
savor	Give taste to. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
sip	Drink in sips. <i>She was sipping her tea.</i>
soda	A sodium salt of carbonic acid; used in making soap powders and glass and paper. <i>A can of soda.</i>

sugar	Spread a mixture of sugar treacle beer etc on a tree trunk in order to catch moths. <i>A spoonful of sugar.</i>
sweeten	Make sweeter, more pleasant, or more agreeable. <i>I am in the process of sweetening him up.</i>
tang	The projection on the blade of a tool such as a knife, by which the blade is held firmly in the handle. <i>His words came out with a distinct tang of broad Lancashire.</i>
tea	The evergreen shrub or small tree which produces tea leaves native to southern and eastern Asia and grown as a major cash crop. <i>Tea bags containing teas from selected estates.</i>
tonic	Music the first note of a diatonic scale. <i>Being needed is a tonic for someone at my age.</i>
vino	Fermented juice (of grapes especially.
