Make obscure or mysterious.

mystify Lawyers who **mystify** the legal system so that laymen find it

unintelligible.

Surprise and confuse (someone) so much that they are unsure how to

Diane was **nonplus**sed by such an odd question.

perplex Complicate or confuse (a matter.

They were **perplex**ing a subject plain in itself.

Assume a posture as for artistic purposes.

pose

He posed her on the sofa.

Think hard about something because one cannot understand it.

She was **puzzle**d by the doctor s manner.

Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist

stick separation.

Stick the corner of the sheet under the mattress.

dumbfound Greatly astonish or amaze.
