addle	(of an egg) rotten. <i>Being in love must have addled your brain.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>
astound	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
baffle	Totally bewilder or perplex. <i>An unexplained occurrence that baffled everyone.</i>
befuddle	Make stupid with alcohol. <i>This question befuddled even the teacher.</i>
bemuse	Cause to be confused emotionally. <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
confound	Cause surprise or confusion in (someone), especially by not according with their expectations. <i>He was forever confounding managerialism with idealism.</i>
confuse	Mistake one thing for another. <i>The constant attention of the young man confused her.</i>
discomfit	Make (someone) feel uneasy or embarrassed. <i>He was not noticeably discomfited by her tone.</i>
disconcert	Disturb the composure of; unsettle. <i>The abrupt change of subject disconcerted her.</i>
disorder	Bring disorder to. <i>They are disordering the political landscape.</i>
disorient	Cause to be lost or disoriented. <i>I was disoriented by the dark.</i>
dumbfound	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>His efforts dumbfounded some members of the group.</i>

embarrass	Cause to be embarrassed cause to feel self conscious. <i>He would be embarrassed by estate duty.</i>
faze	Disturb the composure of. <i>She was not fazed by his show of anger.</i>
flurry	Cause to feel embarrassment. <i>There was a flurry of chicken feathers.</i>
fluster	Be flustered behave in a confused manner. <i>There s nothing you can do or say to fluster Bernie.</i>
jumble	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>A drawer full of letters jumbled together.</i>
<u>maze</u>	Complex system of paths or tunnels in which it is easy to get lost. <i>The house has a maze and a walled Italian garden.</i>
mystify	Utterly bewilder or perplex (someone). <i>Lawyers who mystify the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.</i>
<u>obfuscate</u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The new rule is more likely to obfuscate people than enlighten them.</i>
perplex	Make more complicated. <i>She was perplexed by her husband s moodiness.</i>
<u>perplexed</u>	Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment. <i>Perplexed language.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>She looked puzzled and angry with him.</i>
questioning	Perplexed (as if being expected to know something that you do not know). <i>This situation should prompt questioning.</i>
sadden	Cause to feel sorrow; make unhappy. <i>I was saddened to see their lack of commitment.</i>
stupefy	Make senseless or dizzy by or as if by a blow. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>A surprise attack.</i>
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. <i>A surprised expression.</i>
<u>thwart</u>	A structural crosspiece forming a seat for a rower in a boat. <i>He never did anything to thwart his father.</i>
