obfuscation Darkening or obscuring the sight of something.

When confronted with sharp questions they resort to **obfuscation**.

puzzlement Confusion resulting from failure to understand.

I scratched my head in puzzlement.

- The three of them looked at him in bewilderment.

amaze Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment.

A feeling of great surprise or wonder.

dread Greatly feared dreadful.

That **dread** being we dare oppose.

dumbfound Greatly astonish or amaze.

I was **dumbfound**ed by the low prices there.

exclamation A loud complaint or protest or reproach.

She gave an **exclamation** of delight.



Greatly surprised or astonished.

flabbergasted Flabbergasted fans took to the streets to celebrate the team s big

win.

gasp Strain to obtain air by gasping. She gave a **qasp** and fainted.

A mistaken belief about or interpretation of something.

misapprehension People tried to exchange the vouchers under the **misapprehension**

that they were book tokens.

misunderstanding A disagreement or quarrel.

There must have been some kind of **misunderstanding**.

mystification The activity of obscuring people's understanding, leaving them baffled

or bewildered.

mystify
Utterly bewilder or perplex (someone.

Mystify the story.

outcry A strong expression of public disapproval or anger.

An **outcry** of spontaneous passion.

Make (someone) feel completely baffled.

They were **perplex**ing a subject plain in itself.

unable to understand; perplexed.

The questioners were met with **puzzled** looks.

serendipityGood luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries.

A fortunate stroke of **serendipity**.

startle To stimulate to action.

The loud noise **startle**d him awake.

Astonish and shock.

stupefy The amount they spend on clothes would appal their parents and

stupefy their grandparents.

surprise Cause to be surprised.

I was **surprise**d at his statement.

surprisedTaken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.

There was a **surprised** silence.

wonder Something that causes feelings of wonder.

I wonder whether this was the right thing to do.
