beguile	Help (time) pass pleasantly. To <b>beguile</b> some of the time they went to the cinema.
<u>captivate</u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was <b>captivate</b>d by her beauty.</i>
capture	Bring about the capture of an elementary particle or celestial body and causing it enter a new orbit. Black cannot <b>capture</b> the knight.
cast a spell on	Choose at random.
catch	Discover or come upon accidentally suddenly or unexpectedly catch somebody doing something or in a certain state. <i>Ears open to catch every sound.</i>



<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. The books have <b>charm</b> ed children the world over.
delight	Take delight in. They <b>delight</b> in playing tricks.
enamor	Attract cause to be enamored.
enamour	Be filled with love for. It is not difficult to see why Edward is <b>enamour</b> ed of her.
<u>enchant</u>	Fill (someone) with great delight; charm. Isabel was <b>enchant</b> ed with the idea.
enrapture	Give intense pleasure or joy to. Ruth was <b>enrapture</b> d by the sleeping child.
enthral	Capture the fascinated attention of. She had been so <b>enthral</b> led by the adventure that she had hardly noticed the cold.
<u>entrance</u>	Attract; cause to be enamored.
<u>fascinate</u>	Cause to be interested or curious. I ve always been <b>fascinate</b> d by computers.
<u>glamour</u>	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something.
<u>hex</u>	Cast a spell over someone or something put a hex on someone or something. <i>He</i> <b>hex</b> <i>ed her with his fingers</i> .
hold spellbound	Cover as for protection against noise or smell.
hypnotize	Capture the whole attention of (someone); fascinate. She gazed down <b>hypnotize</b> d by the swirling tide.
jinx	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something. <i>This project is jinxed.</i>
magnetise	Make magnetic.
magnetize	Give magnetic properties to; make magnetic. <i>The current creates a field to <b>magnetize</b> the core in alternate</i> <i>directions.</i>
mesmerise	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet.
mesmerize	Capture the complete attention of (someone); transfix. <i>They were <b>mesmerize</b>d by his story.</i>
put a spell on	Make an investment.



ravish	Hold spellbound. An angry father who suspects that his daughter has been <b>ravish</b> ed.
spellbind	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. The singer held the audience spellbound.
trance	Put into a trance. She s been <b>trance</b> d and may need waking.
transfix	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>A field mouse is <b>transfix</b>ed by the curved talons of an owl.</i>
<u>witch</u>	(of a woman) enchant (a man. Mrs Mucharski had somehow <b>witch</b> ed the house.
