- *Attract strongly, as if with a magnet.*
- *Enchant and delight (someone).*
- *Attract; cause to be enamored.*



## Synonyms of "Bewitch" as a verb (31 Words)

<b>becharm</b>	Attract; cause to be enamored.
<b>beguile</b>	Help (time) pass pleasantly. <i>To <b>beguile</b> some of the time they went to the cinema.</i>
<b><u><a href="#">captivate</a></u></b>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was <b>captivated</b> by her beauty.</i>
<b>capture</b>	Bring about the capture of an elementary particle or celestial body and causing it enter a new orbit. <i>Black cannot <b>capture</b> the knight.</i>
<b>cast a spell on</b>	Choose at random.
<b>catch</b>	Discover or come upon accidentally suddenly or unexpectedly catch somebody doing something or in a certain state. <i>Ears open to <b>catch</b> every sound.</i>

<b><u>charm</u></b>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. <i>The books have <b>charmed</b> children the world over.</i>
<b>delight</b>	Take delight in. <i>They <b>delight</b> in playing tricks.</i>
<b>enamor</b>	Attract cause to be enamored.
<b>enamour</b>	Be filled with love for. <i>It is not difficult to see why Edward is <b>enamoured</b> of her.</i>
<b><u>enchant</u></b>	Fill (someone) with great delight; charm. <i>Isabel was <b>enchanted</b> with the idea.</i>
<b>enrapture</b>	Give intense pleasure or joy to. <i>Ruth was <b>enraptured</b> by the sleeping child.</i>
<b>enthral</b>	Capture the fascinated attention of. <i>She had been so <b>enthralled</b> by the adventure that she had hardly noticed the cold.</i>
<b><u>entrance</u></b>	Attract; cause to be enamored.
<b><u>fascinate</u></b>	Cause to be interested or curious. <i>I ve always been <b>fascinated</b> by computers.</i>
<b><u>glamour</u></b>	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something.
<b><u>hex</u></b>	Cast a spell over someone or something put a hex on someone or something. <i>He <b>hexed</b> her with his fingers.</i>
<b>hold spellbound</b>	Cover as for protection against noise or smell.
<b>hypnotize</b>	Capture the whole attention of (someone); fascinate. <i>She gazed down <b>hypnotized</b> by the swirling tide.</i>
<b>jinx</b>	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something. <i>This project is <b>jinxed</b>.</i>
<b>magnetise</b>	Make magnetic.
<b>magnetize</b>	Give magnetic properties to; make magnetic. <i>The current creates a field to <b>magnetize</b> the core in alternate directions.</i>
<b>mesmerise</b>	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet.
<b>mesmerize</b>	Capture the complete attention of (someone); transfix. <i>They were <b>mesmerized</b> by his story.</i>
<b>put a spell on</b>	Make an investment.

<b>ravish</b>	Hold spellbound. <i>An angry father who suspects that his daughter has been <b>ravished</b>.</i>
<b>spellbind</b>	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<b>trance</b>	Put into a trance. <i>She s been <b>tranced</b> and may need waking.</i>
<b>transfix</b>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>A field mouse is <b>transfixed</b> by the curved talons of an owl.</i>
<b>witch</b>	(of a woman) enchant (a man). <i>Mrs Mucharski had somehow <b>witched</b> the house.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Bewitch" as a verb

- *They both were bewitched by the golden luminosity of Italy.*
- *A handsome prince who had been bewitched by a sorceress.*
