Synonyms of "Bewitch" as a verb (31 Words)

becharm	Attract; cause to be enamored.
beguile	Help (time) pass pleasantly. <i>To beguile some of the time they went to the cinema.</i>
<u>captivate</u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was captivated by her beauty.</i>
capture	Bring about the capture of an elementary particle or celestial body and causing it enter a new orbit. <i>Black cannot capture the knight.</i>
cast a spell on	Choose at random.
catch	Discover or come upon accidentally suddenly or unexpectedly catch somebody doing something or in a certain state. <i>Ears open to catch every sound.</i>

<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. <i>The books have charmed children the world over.</i>
delight	Take delight in. <i>They delight in playing tricks.</i>
enamor	Attract cause to be enamored.
enamour	Be filled with love for. <i>It is not difficult to see why Edward is enamoured of her.</i>
<u>enchant</u>	Fill (someone) with great delight; charm. <i>Isabel was enchanted with the idea.</i>
enrapture	Give intense pleasure or joy to. <i>Ruth was enraptured by the sleeping child.</i>
enthral	Capture the fascinated attention of. <i>She had been so enthralled by the adventure that she had hardly noticed the cold.</i>
<u>entrance</u>	Attract; cause to be enamored.
<u>fascinate</u>	Cause to be interested or curious. <i>I ve always been fascinated by computers.</i>
<u>glamour</u>	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something.
<u>hex</u>	Cast a spell over someone or something put a hex on someone or something. <i>He hexed her with his fingers.</i>
hold spellbound	Cover as for protection against noise or smell.
hypnotize	Capture the whole attention of (someone); fascinate. <i>She gazed down hypnotized by the swirling tide.</i>
jinx	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something. <i>This project is jinxed.</i>
magnetise	Make magnetic.
magnetize	Give magnetic properties to; make magnetic. <i>The current creates a field to magnetize the core in alternate directions.</i>
mesmerise	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet.
mesmerize	Capture the complete attention of (someone); transfix. <i>They were mesmerized by his story.</i>
put a spell on	Make an investment.

ravish	Hold spellbound. <i>An angry father who suspects that his daughter has been ravished.</i>
spellbind	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
trance	Put into a trance. <i>She s been tranced and may need waking.</i>
transfix	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>A field mouse is transfixed by the curved talons of an owl.</i>
witch	(of a woman) enchant (a man). <i>Mrs Mucharski had somehow witched the house.</i>



Usage Examples of "Bewitch" as a verb

- *They both were bewitched by the golden luminosity of Italy.*
- *A handsome prince who had been bewitched by a sorceress.*
