Biannual as an Adjective

Definitions of "Biannual" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “biannual” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Occurring or payable twice each year.*
- *Occurring twice a year.*



Synonyms of "Biannual" as an adjective (3 Words)

- biyearly** Done, produced, or occurring every two years or twice a year.
*The **biyearly** match.*
- half-yearly** Occurring or payable twice each year.
- semiannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.

Usage Examples of "Biannual" as an adjective

- *The biannual meeting of the planning committee.*

Associations of "Biannual" (30 Words)

- again** In addition to what has already been mentioned.
*She tried **again**.*

almanac	An annual publication including weather forecasts and other miscellaneous information arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
annual	An annual plant. <i>The sponsored walk became an annual event.</i>
annually	Without missing a year. <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
biennial	A biennial plant. <i>The first of a series of biennial exhibitions.</i>
bimonthly	A periodical produced twice a month or every two months. <i>The magazine appears bimonthly.</i>
biweekly	Twice a week. <i>She followed her doctor's instructions to undergo health checks biweekly.</i>
cyclical	Recurring in cycles. <i>The cyclical nature of the cement industry.</i>
daily	Of or belonging to or occurring every day. <i>Daily routine.</i>
day-to-day	A period of opportunity.
diurnal	(of animals) active in the daytime. <i>Diurnal flowers are open during the day and closed at night.</i>
intermittent	Occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady. <i>Intermittent rain showers.</i>
monthly	A magazine that is published once a month. <i>Monthly payments.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. <i>An oft quoted tenet.</i>
perennial	A perennial plant. <i>His perennial distrust of the media.</i>
perennially	On a yearly basis for several years. <i>A new blow to the perennially struggling economy.</i>
periodic	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The periodic appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
periodical	(of a magazine or newspaper) published at regular intervals. <i>She took periodical gulps of her tea.</i>
periodically	From time to time; occasionally. <i>I will periodically check on your progress.</i>
periodicity	The quality or character of being periodic; the tendency to recur at intervals. <i>The periodicity of the sunspot cycle.</i>

quarterly	Done, produced, or occurring once every quarter of a year. <i>Interest is paid quarterly.</i>
regular	In accord with regular practice or procedure. <i>This place is a regular fisherman s paradise.</i>
regularity	The state or quality of being regular. <i>He was famous for the regularity of his habits.</i>
<u>regularly</u>	With a constant or definite pattern, especially with the same space between individual items. <i>Make a point of regularly consulting the noticeboard.</i>
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.
triennial	Lasting for or relating to a period of three years. <i>The triennial meeting of the Association.</i>
twice	Double in degree or quantity. <i>The earl married twice.</i>
<u>weekly</u>	Without missing a week. <i>A weekly visit.</i>
<u>year</u>	A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity. <i>She had a composure well beyond her years.</i>
<u>yearly</u>	A reference book that is published regularly once every year. <i>Rent was paid yearly.</i>
