### **Definitions of "Biannual" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “biannual” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Occurring or payable twice each year.*
- *Occurring twice a year.*



### Synonyms of "Biannual" as an adjective (3 Words)

- biyearly** Done, produced, or occurring every two years or twice a year.  
*The **biyearly** match.*
- half-yearly** Occurring or payable twice each year.
- semiannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.

### Usage Examples of "Biannual" as an adjective

- *The biannual meeting of the planning committee.*

### Associations of "Biannual" (30 Words)

- again** In addition to what has already been mentioned.  
*She tried **again**.*

<b>almanac</b>	An annual publication including weather forecasts and other miscellaneous information arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
<b>annual</b>	An annual plant. <i>The sponsored walk became an <b>annual</b> event.</i>
<b>annually</b>	Without missing a year. <i>They travel to China <b>annually</b>.</i>
<b>biennial</b>	A biennial plant. <i>The first of a series of <b>biennial</b> exhibitions.</i>
<b>bimonthly</b>	A periodical produced twice a month or every two months. <i>The magazine appears <b>bimonthly</b>.</i>
<b>biweekly</b>	Twice a week. <i>She followed her doctor's instructions to undergo health checks <b>biweekly</b>.</i>
<b>cyclical</b>	Recurring in cycles. <i>The <b>cyclical</b> nature of the cement industry.</i>
<b>daily</b>	Of or belonging to or occurring every day. <i><b>Daily</b> routine.</i>
<b>day-to-day</b>	A period of opportunity.
<b>diurnal</b>	(of animals) active in the daytime. <i><b>Diurnal</b> flowers are open during the day and closed at night.</i>
<b>intermittent</b>	Occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady. <i><b>Intermittent</b> rain showers.</i>
<b>monthly</b>	A magazine that is published once a month. <i><b>Monthly</b> payments.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>
<b>perennial</b>	A perennial plant. <i>His <b>perennial</b> distrust of the media.</i>
<b>perennially</b>	On a yearly basis for several years. <i>A new blow to the <b>perennially</b> struggling economy.</i>
<b>periodic</b>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The <b>periodic</b> appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
<b>periodical</b>	(of a magazine or newspaper) published at regular intervals. <i>She took <b>periodical</b> gulps of her tea.</i>
<b>periodically</b>	From time to time; occasionally. <i>I will <b>periodically</b> check on your progress.</i>
<b>periodicity</b>	The quality or character of being periodic; the tendency to recur at intervals. <i>The <b>periodicity</b> of the sunspot cycle.</i>

<b>quarterly</b>	Done, produced, or occurring once every quarter of a year. <i>Interest is paid <b>quarterly</b>.</i>
<b>regular</b>	In accord with regular practice or procedure. <i>This place is a <b>regular</b> fisherman s paradise.</i>
<b>regularity</b>	The state or quality of being regular. <i>He was famous for the <b>regularity</b> of his habits.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	With a constant or definite pattern, especially with the same space between individual items. <i>Make a point of <b>regularly</b> consulting the noticeboard.</i>
<b>semiannual</b>	Occurring or payable twice each year.
<b>triennial</b>	Lasting for or relating to a period of three years. <i>The <b>triennial</b> meeting of the Association.</i>
<b>twice</b>	Double in degree or quantity. <i>The earl married <b>twice</b>.</i>
<b><u>weekly</u></b>	Without missing a week. <i>A <b>weekly</b> visit.</i>
<b><u>year</u></b>	A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity. <i>She had a composure well beyond her <b>years</b>.</i>
<b><u>yearly</u></b>	A reference book that is published regularly once every year. <i>Rent was paid <b>yearly</b>.</i>
