Biblical as an Adjective

Definitions of "Biblical" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “biblical” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Resembling the language or style of the Bible.*
- *Very great; on a very large scale.*
- *Of or pertaining to or contained in or in accordance with the Bible.*
- *Relating to or contained in the Bible.*
- *In keeping with the nature of the Bible or its times or people.*



Synonyms of "Biblical" as an adjective (3 Words)

- fundamentalist** Relating to or advocating strict adherence to the basic principles of any subject or discipline.
*The **fundamentalist** ideologies of market and state.*
- orthodox** Of the ordinary or usual type; normal.
*They avoided **orthodox** jazz venues.*
- scriptural** Of or pertaining to or contained in or in accordance with the Bible.
***Scriptural** quotations from Genesis.*



Usage Examples of "Biblical" as an adjective

- *The biblical account of creation.*
- *Biblical times.*
- *We need rainfall of biblical proportions to bring us back to normal.*
- *Biblical Hebrew.*
- *There is a biblical cadence in the last words he utters.*
- *Biblical names.*



Associations of "Biblical" (30 Words)

- apocalypse** A cosmic cataclysm in which God destroys the ruling powers of evil.
*The **apocalypse** of World War II.*
- apocrypha** 14 books of the Old Testament included in the Vulgate (except for II Esdras) but omitted in Jewish and Protestant versions of the Bible; eastern Christian churches (except the Coptic Church) accept all these books as canonical; the Russ.
- apostle** Each of the twelve chief disciples of Jesus Christ.
*An **apostle** of revolution.*
- archdeacon** An ecclesiastical dignitary usually ranking just below a bishop.
- canon** A general law, rule, principle, or criterion by which something is judged.
*Legislation which enables the Church of England General Synod to provide by **canon** for women to be ordained.*

<u>cathedral</u>	The principal church of a diocese, with which the bishop is officially associated. <i>St Paul's Cathedral.</i>
<u>christian</u>	Relating to or characteristic of Christianity.
<u>church</u>	Take a woman who has recently given birth to church for a service of thanksgiving. <i>The church was largely rebuilt at the end of the 15th century.</i>
clairvoyant	A person who claims to have a supernatural ability to perceive events in the future or beyond normal sensory contact. <i>He didn't tell me about it and I'm not clairvoyant.</i>
dean	United States film actor whose moody rebellious roles made him a cult figure (1931-1955). <i>He is the dean of foreign correspondents.</i>
deist	Of or relating to deism.
diocese	The territorial jurisdiction of a bishop.
doyen	A man who is the senior member of a group. <i>He became the doyen of British physicists.</i>
evangelist	The writer of one of the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John). <i>An American television evangelist.</i>
exegesis	Critical explanation or interpretation of a text, especially of scripture. <i>The task of biblical exegesis.</i>
<u>exodus</u>	The departure of the Israelites from Egypt. <i>The annual exodus of sun seeking Canadians to Florida.</i>
foretell	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
<u>goddess</u>	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>Athena Nike goddess of victory.</i>
holy	A sacred place of pilgrimage. <i>Saints and holy men.</i>
<u>interpretation</u>	An explanation of something that is not immediately obvious. <i>The report included his interpretation of the forensic evidence.</i>
mythological	Relating to, based on, or appearing in myths or mythology. <i>The tree of life is one of the oldest of all mythological symbols.</i>
oracle	A response or message given by an oracle especially an ambiguous one. <i>He reigned supreme as the Colonial Office's oracle on Africa.</i>
priestess	A woman priest.

prophecy	Deliver a sermon. <i>Jacques was prophecying a bumper harvest.</i>
prophet	In Christian use the books of Isaiah Jeremiah Ezekiel Daniel and the twelve minor prophets. <i>He is repeatedly hailed as a prophet of modernism.</i>
recitation	A public instance of reciting or repeating (from memory) something prepared in advance. <i>The recitation of traditional poems.</i>
scriptural	From or relating to the Bible. <i>Scriptural quotations from Genesis.</i>
scripture	The sacred writings of a religion other than Christianity. <i>Passages of scripture.</i>
seer	A person of supposed supernatural insight who sees visions of the future. <i>Our seers have grown gloomier about prospects for growth.</i>
theology	A particular system or school of religious beliefs and teachings. <i>In Christian theology God comes to be conceived as Father and Son.</i>
